#### What can I expect for my child?

Whether your child chooses to ride for a week during the summer or for years to come, our focus at Legacy is to give your child a solid foundation so they are able to become competent and confident riders. Lessons at Legacy are tailored to suit the needs and goals of each individual student, whether they are a first time rider or experienced competitor.

#### Why should I choose Legacy?

Legacy has highly qualified experienced instructors, well trained quality lesson horses, and small class sizes to maximize individual attention for each student.

#### Where is Legacy located?

Legacy is located in the Bear Creek area of Woodinville, adjacent to the Tolt Pipeline Trail at 19802 NE 148<sup>th</sup> St. Woodinville, WA 98077.

#### What will my child learn?

Campers will have daily mounted riding lessons as well as un-mounted horsemanship lessons. During the mounted lessons, your child will learn proper and safe English (Hunt Seat) riding techniques. Un-mounted lessons include basic horsemanship skills, equine first aid, grooming, tacking up the horse, general barn safety and much more.

#### What other activities will my child do during camp?

- Fun equestrian games and activities to improve their knowledge and skills.

#### What are the requirements?

- Legacy accepts riders 7 years of age and older.
- Paddock boots with a heel and an ASTM/SEI certified English riding helmet are required. Local tack stores can assist with these purchases and often offer discount coupons for beginning riders.
- Campers are to take one pre-camp evaluation lesson, included in the cost of the camp session.

### **Why the pre-camp evaluation lesson?**

The pre-camp lesson provides an opportunity for instructor to become familiar with each student's abilities and prior horse knowledge. The lesson gives each student an opportunity to grasp the fundamental concepts of riding so they are prepared to safely ride with other campers during their session, maximizing the riding experience.

**What are the camp session days and times?** Monday through Friday 9:30 AM – 2:00 PM.

**What is the cost?** \$650 per session. Cost includes one pre-camp evaluation lesson.

A nonrefundable deposit of \$100 is required to process enrollment prior to June 1st. The balance of \$550 is due on June 1st. Full payment of \$650 is due if enrolling after June 1st.

### **How do I go about enrolling my child in the Legacy camp program?**

Please complete and mail or email the camp registration form. A staff member will contact you to confirm the camp session, arrange a mutually convenient time for you and your child to tour the facility, discuss any questions you may have, and set up the pre-camp evaluation lesson.

### **What if all the sessions are full?**

Additional sessions may be offered. Alternately, the staff at Legacy can design a summer riding program that will mutually meet your child's needs.

Yes, Legacy hosts on-site horse shows open to student participation. Outside barns may also attend Legacy's horse shows. Classes are offered to suit riders of all levels. A qualified judge and show staff create an authentic horse show experience. Riding academy students also have the opportunity to compete at horse shows held at Bridle Trails State Park, Kirkland, WA.
