MEETING DISCUSSION

- Member Updates
 - Mobile Housing Team
 - JOIN was selected to run the multi-agency mobile Permanent Supportive Housing Team (PSH) team and the team is being assembled.
 - Coordinated Access:
 - Training on using the Family and Adult Tool trainings are underway
 - Focusing on Unity Behavioral Health Center, Emanuel, and Providence
- Columbia Willamette Health Needs Assessment (CHNA)
 - Intended to be a collaborative regional effort to collect health data.
 - Partners include Coordinated Care Organizations (CCO) and hospitals.
 - Various publicly available data
 - Engage in the community to gauge population health.
 - Helps inform member organizations plans for the community.
 - Two assessments have been completed with 2016 being the most recent
 - The CHNA will be used for program planning, planning/priorities, strategic planning, grant applications, identifying key partnerships and working toward a culture of health and well-being among community partners.
 - In 2014, took an inventory of existing efforts and used 14 listening sessions to incorporate community voice in the planning process.
 - 2016 improvements; looked at CCO's Medicaid data, hospital data, underserved populations data, and a survey of 3,000 participants.
 - Group discussed and confirmed that the survey was not distributed to A Home for Everyone during this time.
 - Priority populations were identified
 - Possible to distribute during the next assessment?
 - Social determinates of health: asking "why?" helps to determine the root causes.
 - Health Status Assessment, Community Themes and Strengths
 - Key individual behaviors influencing health
 - Adults smoking cigarettes
 - Binge drinking

- Inadequate fruit and vegetable consumption
- Lack of adults receiving a flu shot
- Lack of older adults receiving pneumonia vaccine
- Teenagers drinking alcohol
- Teenagers using marijuana
- Teenagers not engaging in physical activity
- Usage of e cigarettes and vaping products
- Lack of usual source of health care
 - ◆ These were prioritized across four counties by amount of people affected
 - ◆ Feedback about the wording "individual behaviors" suggesting personal choice not highlighting root cause for these circumstances
 - ◆ High level identified
- Top identified diseases
 - Asthma
 - Cancer (9 types)
 - Chlamydia
 - Depression
 - Hypertension
 - High cholesterol
 - Obesity/overweight
- Top identified causes of death
 - Alcohol induced
 - Alzheimer's diseases
 - Breast cancer
 - Diabetes
 - Drug induced
 - Heart disease
 - Leukemia and lymphoma
 - Non transport accidents (e.g. poisoning falls
 - Suicide
- Emergency Department Utilization
 - Youth (0-18 years)
 - Severe ear, nose and throat infections
 - Asthma
 - Post-traumatic stress disorder
 - Attention deficit disorder
 - Advisory Council to help form the methodology?
 - ◆ Rachel Post suggested addition of economist to the advisory council. (e.g. EcoNorthwest)
 - ◆ Listening sessions focused on people experiencing homelessness conducted with Clackamas service center, Central City Concern (CCC), Outside In, and others.
 - ◆ Access to primary care highlighted within group as having great influence on other health factors.
 - ◆ Q Corp housing each participant members plans/assessments
 - ◆ Rachel will leave her organization's assessment for group to review
- Follow-up requested:

- Health Workgroup offering support in addressing issues that are commonly outside of the traditional healthcare scope.
 - Health Workgroup to coordinate on writing a letter requesting follow-up information on issue areas the group identified.
- Action Plan Items Review and Prioritization
 - Work towards grouping items in survey along with an estimated timeline.
 - Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU), Providence and Kaiser Permanente meeting to look at ways to add housing status question to EPIC.
 - Legacy Health engaged in conversations and might be interested in being involved.
