

Detroit Horse Power is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit founded in 2015 by former Detroit elementary school teacher David Silver. We harness the power of horses to expand opportunities for Detroit's youth. We teach Detroit students to ride and care for horses to develop critical skills that will prepare them for academic, career, and life success. Our vision is to give under-resourced youth a safe and enriching space that furthers their future development.

OUR GUIDING PRINCIPLES

ERSEVERANCE

Never give up, even when it's really hard; you try again and stick with it until you reach your goal.

MPATHY

To put yourself in your horse's hooves; seeing life from a different perspective will infuse care and compassion into your worldview.

ESPONSIBLE RISK-TAKING

Safely step outside your comfort zone; be open to trying new horse-related activities.

ONFIDENCE

In your skills and ability to succeed. Knowing that your work with horses can translate seamlessly into the self-belief it takes to move you through life.

ELF-CONTROL

Check in with your emotions. Horses enhance self-awareness as they reflect whatever you are feeling in their behavior.





SCHREIBER FAMILY STORY

The Schreiber family immigrated from Eastern Europe to the United States through New York and settled in Detroit in 1916. Four generations of Schreibers, including myself, were all born in the city, and we have built and operated a family-owned roofing company for over 107 years. The company was located just down the road from the new DHP property until recently, when it was moved to Wixom.

Growing up, my family split our time between Detroit and Hamilton, Ontario, where my mother was from, and my father started a second roofing company. Both of my parents were very active, and we spent much of our time outdoors. While in Detroit that included regular trips to the Detroit Zoo and to Greenfield Village to enjoy the animals that we all loved. In Hamilton, I was fortunate enough to have access to horses and horse back riding that wasn't easily accessible while we were in Detroit.

Horses shaped much of my youth, and after college, I gravitated back to the equine industry, living on a farm with my husband and helping build and operate a successful horse show series in Northern Michigan. This led me to meet David Silver and learn about Detroit Horse Power. I immediately connected to the mission of DHP for multiple reasons, and my husband and I have been supporters ever since.

We are grateful for the opportunity to help bring the magic of horses and all they can teach to the Youth of Detroit. Spending time with the students when they came to a facility we are associated with for a Reining clinic was one of the most rewarding experiences of my life. We are also excited to support the construction of the future home of DHP in the City of Detroit through our foundation and through our company, Schreiber Corporation, Building DHP, a permanent facility in the same neighborhood where we worked, and having the ability to reach so many more Detroit Youth is extraordinary, and we are lucky to be included in the process.





MOVING FORWARD



This past year has moved Detroit Horse Power across several crucial milestones as the organization positions this project for its future groundbreaking. In 2023, McIntosh Poris Architects completed the design development phase, and we worked with L.S. Brinker on updated pricing and value engineering. In addition, we are fortunate to have worked closely with the Sustainability Institute of Detroit to align our building design with environmental sustainability best practices that will lower our carbon footprint and long-term operating expenses. Detroit Horse Power also took important strides toward our city approval by submitting our plans for site plan review, as well as working with Detroit Public Schools Community District to accelerate the timeline by which we will purchase the property. The capital campaign took several major steps forward in the past year, securing our largest commitments from the State of Michigan, Kresge Foundation, and Meijer Foundation, among others. This momentum has set the stage to turn this big vision into a reality in the year ahead.
