Camp Fee: \$300 (plus \$10 membership fee if child is not already a member of CTRA)

Payment Policies:

- All cheques should be made payable to the Cowichan Therapeutic Riding Association.
- Payment can be made via cheque, cash, Visa or MasterCard.
- **Spaces cannot be reserved until payment is received, or payment from other agencies has been confirmed with the CTRA office.**
- **Registration Form must be completed in full to reserve a spot.**
- All campers must be full members of CTRA. Riders currently enrolled in our programs are already members. Full membership for the year is \$10.
- Before February 20th, 2018 campers may receive a full refund less a \$50 administration fee.
- After February 20th, 2018 full refunds (less \$50 admin. fee) will only be given in situations where a documented health concern is involved. All other situations will receive a 75% refund ONLY if the space is filled by another camper.
- If the camp does not fulfill its minimum required capacity, CTRA reserves the right to cancel the program and refund client fees in full.

CTRA Riding Camp

“CTRA” has been providing safe, exciting, and educational riding camps for the children of the Cowichan Valley for over 20 years. Each camp includes campers from all walks of life and blends therapeutic riders with integrated riders from the community.

Each camper is paired with one of our gentle therapy horses or ponies. In some cases riders may share a mount with another camper. Our dedicated and engaging riding teachers are certified CanTRA and/or Equine Canada Instructors or Coaches.

In addition to riding instruction and equine education, campers can expect to develop strong applied horse-ship skills such as grooming, tacking up, stable chores, and equipment care. With a focus on team work and responsibility—these important elements of horse care inspire confidence while allowing each camper to achieve their own level of success. Stable management topics will be taught by certified instructors.

Campers must be between the ages of 7 & 15 .



Camp Schedule

- CTRA offers half-day camps starting at 9am and finishing at 1:30 pm
- Campers should not arrive or be picked-up more than 15 minutes outside of these times.

What to Expect

Riding groups will be made up of no more than 4 riders. Campers will be divided into groups based on experience levels and will cycle through their stable chores, stable management, and riding sessions. These days are jam-packed with education and fun!

Each day will feature a different Stable Management topic and each rider will be provided with an educational camp manual/journal to help them record all they learn.

Each camper will be responsible for cleaning his/her horse’s stall, replenishing water, and helping to keep the aisle swept and clean. Individual assistance will be provided to campers as needed.

Please ensure campers come with food for snack, water, sun protection, and suitable clothing for all weather. Campers must bring pants suitable to ride in. No sandals permitted. Boots with a small heel are encouraged.

It is preferable that campers use their own riding helmets. If borrowing, the *helmet use waiver must be signed*
