CHURCH VALUES

Commitment to Jesus Christ: We believe that salvation is found in Jesus Christ alone who is the only begotten son of the Living God. Through Him, all who come to Him by faith and repent of their sins, receive forgiveness through Christ's death on the Cross and live in newness of life through the transforming power of the Holy Spirit. Worship: We are committed to worship in Word and Sacrament, through the power of the Holy Spirit. Our worship – in glorifying God – is to be authentic and relevant to our cultural setting while remaining within the breadth of the Anglican Tradition.

Servant Ministry: We believe that every Christian is created for ministry, gifted for ministry, and needed for ministry. We are, therefore, committed to equip, empower and release the faithful to use their spiritual gifts to glorify God and to build up the Body of Christ.

Sacrificial Giving: We believe that we are to be generous with our time, talents and money as we share with those in need, support the work of God among us, and spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
