The A Call To Invest in Our Neighborhoods (ACTION) Campaign is a national, grassroots coalition of over 2,000 national, state, and local organizations and businesses calling on Congress to address our nation's severe shortage of affordable rental housing by expanding the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit.

The Low-Income Housing Tax Credit is our nation's most successful tool for encouraging private investment in the production and preservation of affordable rental housing. Since it was created in 1986, it has been a model public-private partnership, financing nearly 3 million affordable apartments to low-income families while transferring risk from the government to the private sector.
