1 st reading– Genesis 18:1-15		

The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, “My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant.” So they said, “Do as you have said.” And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, “Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes.” Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

They said to him, “Where is your wife Sarah?” And he said, “There, in the tent.” Then one said, “I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son.” And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him. Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in age; it had ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women. So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, “After I have grown old, and my husband is old, shall I have pleasure?” The Lord said to Abraham, “Why did Sarah laugh, and say, ‘Shall I indeed bear a child, now that I am old?’ Is anything too wonderful for the Lord? At the set time I will return to you, in due season, and Sarah shall have a son.” But Sarah denied, saying, “I did not laugh”; for she was afraid. He said, “Oh yes, you did laugh.” him a son in his old age.”

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person-- though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.

Gospel reading – Matthew 9:35-10:8

Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and

Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment."

Journey with our new Rector. Leading this tour will be the Rev. Cynthia Espeseth, the Rev. Dr. Dennis Tierney and the Rev. Chris Jillard. Pilgrimage is a holy journey that is very different from a vacation or trip taken for sightseeing. A pilgrimage is a journey to a sacred place to touch and see the places important to our faith. Our Christian tradition holds dear the practice of making pilgrimages as holy experiences of learning, conversion and transformation, and none is more significant than walking the ways of Jesus. This pilgrimage will have the unique Advent focus of preparing the way for Jesus coming into our lives as we journey through the lands where Jesus taught, healed, and confronted the authorities. We will visit the place of the annunciation of Mary, the shrine devoted to the place of Jesus' birth, as well as all those places devoted to the significant events of Jesus life and ministry. However, the shrines are empty unless experienced in a context both ancient and modern. So we will meet with people of the land, we will share meals and worship with them. We will hear stories and explore the realities of the Israeli/Palestinian conflict. We will see the Wailing Wall, walk the way of the cross, and walk along the separation wall. The Rev. Dr. Dennis Tierney, a former teacher and professor brings a life-long interest in the intersection of faith and history. Faith always exists within culture and culture is always shaped by geography, climate, and historical events. Preparing the Way for Jesus is more than personal reflection, prayer, and setting up aesthetic displays. The Holy Land is freighted with many cultures and faiths, blending and clashing through the ages. Putting the riches of the Holy Land into a context will enrich our experience greatly. We have found that our pilgrimages to the Holy Land have opened our ministries and our understanding of what it means to follow Jesus. This pilgrimage will be an Advent journey filled with prayer, hope, and an opportunity to experience the life of Jesus the Christ. Trip starts on November 24th, and return is on December 5, 2017.
