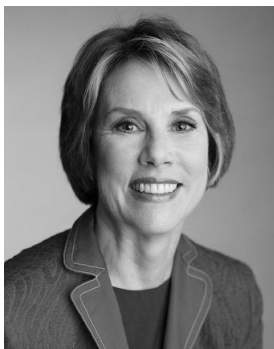


Betsy L. Anderson is Managing Director of Overseas Citizens Service at the U.S. Department of State. Her team of 100 caseworkers, attorneys and children's issues specialists is responsible for managing crises involving U.S. citizens abroad: providing safety and security information, managing inter-country adoptions involving U.S. citizens, preventing international parental child abduction, delivering assistance to U.S. victims of crime and terrorism overseas, and dealing with a host of other emergency and routine matters involving U.S. citizens who travel and reside abroad. Her team's most recent achievement was the assisted

departure of 15,000 U.S. citizens from Lebanon.

A U.S. Foreign Service Officer since 1976, Ms. Anderson has served in a number of posts including Stockholm as Deputy Chief of Mission; Athens as Consul General; Geneva, Switzerland; Dakar, Senegal; Quebec, Canada; and Perth, Australia.

Ms. Anderson was educated at the American University in Washington, D.C., where she received a bachelor of arts in international studies in 1975. She graduated from a year-long program in strategic studies at the Army War College in 1994. She is a member of the House of Sweden in Washington, D.C., and the Association of Diplomatic and Consular Officers Retired. She speaks English, French, Swedish, Greek and Spanish.



Jewelle Bickford is a Rothschild Group Investment Banking Partner — one of 60 worldwide. She is responsible for new business origination in North America and the United Kingdom. Prior to 2003, Mrs. Bickford was Senior Managing Director and Head of Debt Capital Markets for Rothschild Inc., the broker dealer of Rothschild North America. She was also a member of NM Rothschild's Global Banking and Treasury Committee. During Mrs. Bickford's nine years as head of the Debt Capital Markets Group, her team securitized and privately placed 95 transactions, allowing Rothschild to be consistently ranked among the top 10 investments banks for privately placed asset-backed securities.

Mrs. Bickford attended Randolph Macon Women's College and received her B.A. from Sarah Lawrence College in 1977. She presently serves on the Business Committee of the Metropolitan Museum, the Board of Directors of Torrey Funds and the Board of Trustees of Fountain House. She is President of the Trisha Brown Dance Company and serves on the board of the Randolph Macon Women's College. She is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and the Advisory Council of Afghan Women Leaders CONNECT, a special program of Rockefeller Philanthropy Advisors.



Patricia Bivins is an attorney, political consultant, community activist, and most importantly, a mother. A lifelong Texan, Patricia was an attorney with the law firm of Fulbright and Jaworski, was then a lobbyist for a global energy company, and now is a field director and political consultant for the Lieutenant Governor of Texas. Patricia served as the wife of the U.S. Ambassador to Sweden and lived in Stockholm from June 2004 until December 2005. Her time in Sweden was a true honor and highlight in her life.

Now that they have moved back to Texas, she prefers to devote most of her time and energy to raising her three year old daughter, enjoying family, friends, and Texas politics.



Yvonne Thunell is co-founder and partner at Thunell, Odhnoff Sundstrom & Partners (www.dinmentor.se), a mentoring firm specializing in professional and personal development. In addition to her role as a professional mentor and coach to executives, Ms. Thunell consults with corporations to develop mentoring programs. She also designs courses and seminars on modern mentoring techniques.

Ms. Thunell also supports the development of standards for ethics and quality in the mentoring field, working as committee chairman of the European Mentoring and Coaching Council (EMCC, www.emccouncil.org), a pan-European organization. Ms. Thunell co-founded EMCC Sweden as well as the Association for Certified Mentors (DMF, www.dmfmentor.se).

Prior to her work as a professional mentor, Ms. Thunell worked in the IT industry in the United States and Sweden during the 1970s and 1980s. She co-founded Ericsson Programmatic, a U.S. consulting company specializing in data and telecommunications that later became part of the Ericsson Group. Ms. Thunell was also CEO at the AXXA Corporation in Woodland Hills, Calif. Upon returning to Sweden, she founded Career Coach, a human resources consulting firm.



Professor Harriet Wallberg-Henriksson has been President of Karolinska Institutet since 2004. She is a member of Karolinska Institutet Nobel Assembly, which awards the winner of the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine.

Professor Wallberg-Henriksson began her medical career in the 1970s, earning an M.D. and a Ph.D. Since 1998 she has been a professor of physiology. She has also been the Dean of Research at Karolinska Institutet. Between 2001 and 2003 she held the position of Secretary General of the Swedish Research Council for Medicine, where she played a major role in creating ethical guidelines for stem cell research. Since 2004, she has been a member of the International Science and Technology Forum (STS), Tokyo, and a member of the International Scientific Advisory Council to the Government, Singapore.

Professor Wallberg-Henriksson has been appointed by the Government to lead Swedish delegations to the United Nations, and to represent Sweden on the boards of numerous bodies, including the European Science Foundation, the WHO's Agency for Cancer Research and the Heads of International Research Organizations (HIROs), an international group of major research financiers. She has written or co-written more than 130 scientific articles in the field of diabetes and clinical physiology. She was also Vice-President of the European Association for the Study of Diabetes (EASD) from 2002 to 2005.

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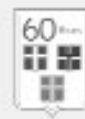

In particular, she has been the longest serving civilian in the Peace missions in Croatia and Bosnia Herzegovina, from 1992 to 1998, working with the UN and the EU, notably in Sarajevo.

Ms. Corazza Bildt now run Italiantradition.com since 6 years, a family based Internet boutique bringing Italian high quality food via the Net and in selected shops. I newly opened a Hotel de Charme, Relais Tabiano Castello in my family estate near Parma, in Northern Italy.

Her aim has been to share the best of her Italian food culture from Parma, where her family has been dedicated to produce Parmesan for 100 years to her new homeland, Sweden, leader in the new economy. She published with Magdalena Ribbing "Käreksfullt från Parma, Människorna, Maten, Traditionerna"

She is a proud member of the Swedish Red Cross Board and the Moderate Party Board for Stockholm. She is a committed European trying to bridge her humanitarian, entrepreneurial and political lives and enjoying both North and Southern Europe.



Beatrice Engström-Bondy is a Senior Adviser to the Chairman of the Board of Investor AB, a position she has held since 2005. Prior to her work at Investor AB, Ms. Engström-Bondy was a Managing Partner at Kreab London, where she worked from 2000 to 2005. From 1995 to 2000, she was Head of Information of Enskilda and Adviser to the Chairman of the Board at SEB in Stockholm.

Ms. Engström-Bondy started her career in the 1980s working for UBS in Zurich as an economist. She also worked for the company in London as head of International Media Relations. She is now a member of the Board of the Swedish Chamber of Commerce for the United Kingdom and a member of the Board of the British-Swedish Chamber of Commerce in Stockholm. She wrote a book on Swiss banking in 1991 and was Chairman of the International School of Stockholm in 1994-95.

Ms. Engström-Bondy was educated in Paris, Zurich, London and Cologne. She received a Ph.D. from the University of Cologne, Germany; one M.S. from the London School of Economics in political science and a second from the University of Zurich, in economics. Born in 1954, Ms. Engström-Bondy has two daughters. She is fluent in five languages.



Monice Svenner is President of the Swedish recycling company, Stena Gotthard, which has more than 700 employees at 70 sites. Previously, Ms. Svenner spent 13 years at Mölnlycke Health Care, working with technical, organizational, quality and factory management. Previously, she worked with product and process development in the flooring and vehicle businesses at Volvo Cars.

Ms. Svenner has a Masters degree in Chemical Engineering as well as a Teachers Diploma in Math, Chemistry and Physics. She grew up in Sao Paulo, Brazil where she was a track star in school. Now, married with two kids, Monica enjoys sailing and golf near her home in Gothenburg.



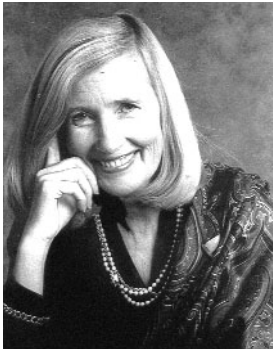
Elisabeth Tarras-Wahlberg was appointed Marshal of the Court and head of the office of Crown Princess Victoria, Prince Carl Philip and Princess Madeleine in October 2004. During almost thirty years at the Royal Court, she has served in the Royal Family's press staff. She has been awarded H.M. the King's medal of the 12th size for her services to the court, and has received a number of foreign decorations.

Ms. Tarras-Wahlberg's close relationship with the Royal Family has made her a mentor to the Crown Princess Victoria. She is also H M the King's speech-writer.

After graduating Phi Beta Kappa from Mount Holyoke College in 1971, Ms. Tarras-Wahlberg studied at the University of Stockholm. Thereafter, she began her career at the Swedish Institute, where she worked as a Study Visit Organizer and then later as Information and Press Secretary.

Ms. Tarras-Wahlberg is also successful author. Her books "Victoria, Victoria" and "Carl XVI Gustaf a Portrait with the Times" are the latest of six books about the Swedish Royal Family.

Ms. Tarras-Wahlberg has two daughters, Filippa 22, and Louisa 18. They reside in Lidingö, close to the center of Stockholm.



Dagmar O'Connor, Ph.D., is a well-known Swedish-born sex therapist who caused a sensation at the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland, this year by teaching world leaders about relationships. She will undoubtedly return to the World Economic Forum in 2007.

Dr. O'Connor was the first female sex therapist to be trained by Masters and Johnson in New York City more than three decades ago. She is the former Director of the Sex Therapy Clinic in the Department of Psychiatry at St. Luke's Roosevelt Hospital Center, also in New York. In addition, Dr. O'Connor is a lecturer in psychiatry at Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center New York.

In 1985, Dr. O'Connor's book, "How To Make Love to the Same Person for the Rest of Your Life and Still Love It," became an instant best seller and was translated into 15 languages. Recently republished by Virgin Books, it is now in its second printing. Publisher's Weekly said the following: "This book deserves to be on every bedside table!"

Dr. O'Connor teaches many sought-after workshops, including "Sex Therapy Vacation for Couples," held in the Caribbean, and "Sexual Self-Esteem." She has also designed videos for home use about her workshops.



Helena Stålnert is the Communications Director at Saab Group, where she has served since June 2005. As Group Senior Vice-President for Communications and Public Affairs, Ms. Stålnert is a member of Saab's distinguished management team.

Ms. Stålnert brings many years of media experience to Saab, with experience in journalism in Sweden and abroad. Beginning in 1987, she served within the Swedish broadcaster Sveriges Television (Public Service). Gunvor Engström is Member of the Board of several Swedish foundations.



Elizabeth J. Heider is Vice-President of Preconstruction for Skanska USA Building Inc. She is responsible for the cost management of large-scale multimillion-dollar construction programs. Ms. Heider's 27 years of professional experience include all phases of design and construction, from master planning through project closeout as a licensed architect, construction manager, cost manager and value engineering (VE) facilitator. She has prepared reports for the Public Building Service (PBS) on the cost implications of federal initiatives, including workplace productivity and security and for the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts on public space.

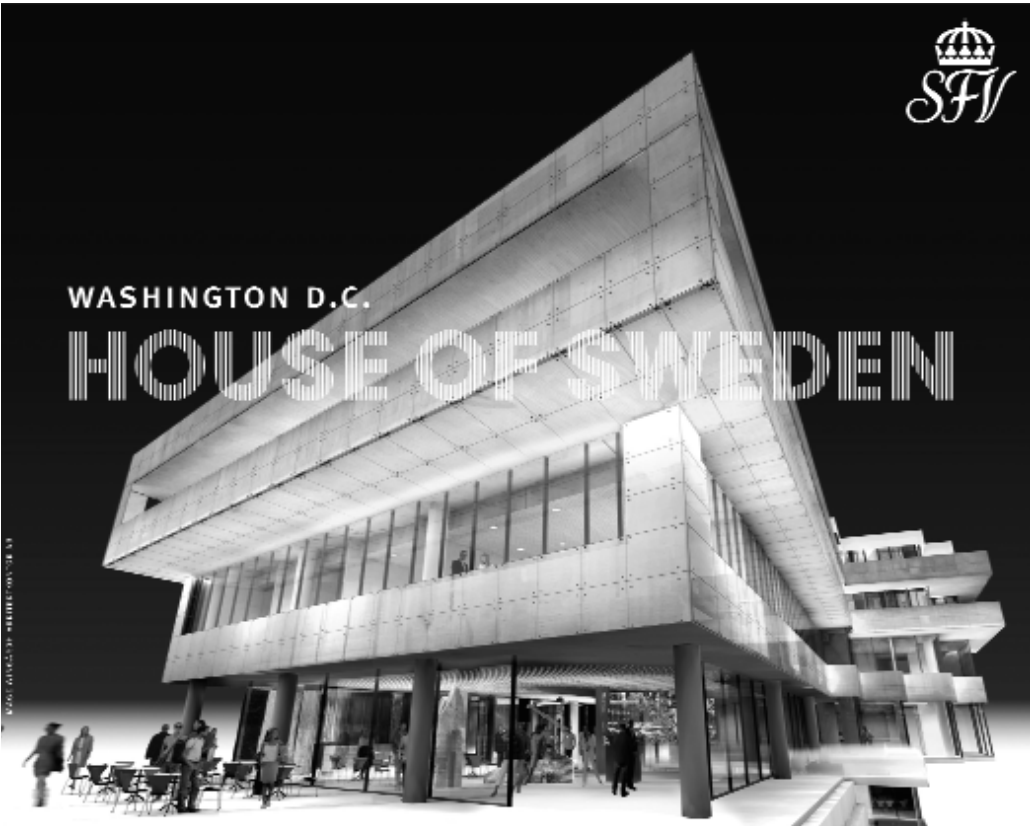
