

SNOW STORM JONAS

According to the National Weather Service, Herndon received 28.4" of snowfall, which was the 2nd largest snowfall ever recorded at Dulles Airport. Despite the record snowfall, VDOT had core roads addressed within 24 hours, operable within 48 hours, and relatively safe after 72 hours.

By comparison, our Reflection townhome contractors had our townhome streets operable within 24 hours, and had the excess snow physically removed, and all parking spaces clear on 90% of our streets by the 72 hour mark.



Our detached home streets, as well as Saunders, Springer, Parcher, and Maleady, are maintained and plowed by VDOT contractors, and many detached home residents had significant problems with being able to get out to Parcher Ave. A complaint has been sent to VDOT.

A great number of individual residents are to be commended for teaming together to deal with Mother Nature's snowy wrath. Residents were out & about aiding their fellow neighbors, digging out vehicles, clearing paths, and pushing stranded cars.

DO'S & DON'TS AFTER A SIGNIFICANT SNOWFALL:

- **DO clear your car and sidewalks**
- **DO NOT shovel snow into the roadway**
- **DO NOT place furniture or other items in parking spaces**
- **DO keep roadways clear for snow removal equipment**

By following these guidelines, our snow removal contractors will be able to complete the job much faster.

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And then there was light . . .

With the exception of one noted street light at the intersection of Berger PI and Oram PI, and one street light on Feldman PI., all street lights *should* be operating correctly at this point. As mentioned in last month's newsletter, Dominion was ignoring our requests for work on the underground cables for the lights. Now that the 'disconnect' has been resolved, extended outages of street lights should no longer occur as they were.
