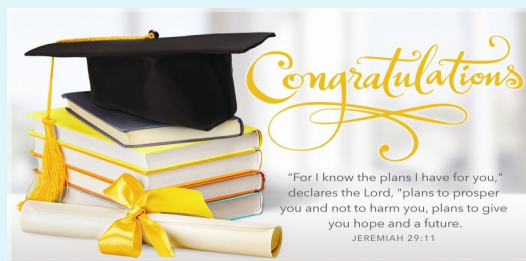

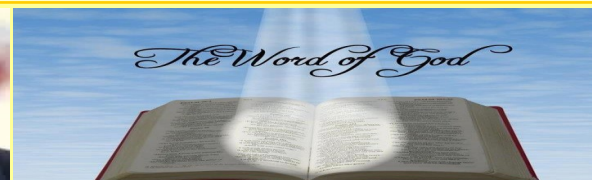

The St. Charles Lwanga Center is named after Charles (Karoli / Carl) Lwanga, a leader among a group of 22 young men who were martyred between 1885 and 1886. Pope Paul VI canonized St. Charles Lwanga and Companions in 1964.
