THE BROOKLYN Antiquarian Book Fair returns for its fourth annual edition, at the Brooklyn Expo Center in the borough's Greenpoint section, September 8–10. Produced by Impact Events Group, it hosts 100 exhibitors from the U.S., Canada, and Europe, making it the largest regional book fair in the country. The presenting sponsor this year is Abebooks, the noted online antiquarian and used book venue.



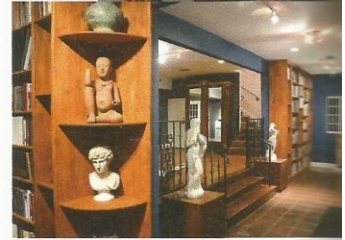
Brooklyn bookseller Lizzy Young will have vintage cookbooks and ephemera including menus from the *Lusitania*; Austin Abbey Rare Books will display books whose gilt-embossed covers reveal artwork under direct light. A new section this year is the Works on Paper gallery, where the offering will include vintage luggage labels from Sheryl Jaeger of Eclectibles; a portfolio by digital type designer Matthew Carter; and The

Black Album, a collection of 10 photographic postcards that is among the first documentations of Nazi atrocities against the Jews of Poland, from dealer Kurt Sanftleben. There will also be an exhibition of works by Brooklyn native Maurice Sendak and a special event on pop-up books.

Expanding Space

THE BAKARAT GALLERY—which boasts international spaces in London, Seoul, and Abu Dhabi—has been a fixture in Beverly Hills for more than three decades. This year, the family owned business, which first established itself in Jerusalem 125 years ago, expanded its reach in Los Angeles to West Hollywood. The new space, which is located in the La Cienega Design Quarter, is a colossal 7,000 square feet, with two floors and 12 rooms. Devoted to ancient art in all forms, the gallery has a Russian icons chapel room, exhibition space dedicated to Classical antiquity, Asian, African, and Pre-Columbian art, and a library with exhaustive holdings of art, history, and archeology texts.

This month the gallery opens its exhibition “Art of the Americas: Before Columbus” (Sept. 23-January 2018).
