The 2013 investment income includes dividends, interest and realized gains of \$5.59 million and unrealized investment gain of \$2.77 million from increase in fair value of investments as at December 31, 2013.

Priesthood Provides a Great Testament to the Beauty of God

As an optimist and extrovert, Msgr. Joe Shiels possesses two excellent qualities to thrive in an extremely social profession: the priesthood. During his 49-year journey as a priest in the Archdiocese of Toronto, he worked tirelessly to involve the laity in the life of the Church.

"The lay people do such wonderful work for the Church and do it out of their own desire to work for the Church. No matter where we are, there are people who truly want to do something for God through lay ministry."

Throughout his priesthood, which included five parish assignments, Msgr. Shiels invited people, often through personal invitations, to use their gifts in service of the Lord. He learned to give people opportunities and trust them to carry out ministries, recognizing sometimes it meant things would not turn out as expected. But with each failure came a chance to learn and to help parishioners realize the gifts they could offer.

Msgr. Shiels was ordained in 1965, just as Vatican II took effect, giving more emphasis to the laity's role in the life of the Church. Thinking back to the time of his ordination, he recalls his anticipation to work with lay people and other pastors. He knew this would involve two things: a lot of work and a lot of joy.

Ways of Giving to The Shepherds' Trust

There are various ways of making gifts to The Shepherds' Trust, each method offering tax benefits that may significantly reduce the cost of your gift.

1. Gifts of Cash

By far, the most popular method of support, a gift of cash, provides an immediate benefit to the Trust and an instant tax receipt for you. You may receive a tax credit for a gift of up to 75% of your annual net income in any one year and you may carry forward any excess for a period of up to five years. Spouses may combine their charitable receipts on one income tax return even if the receipts are not in both names.

Gifts of cash may be given through the parish on the weekend of November 15-16, 2014, or post-dated cheques throughout the year. Cheques should be made payable to: Parish Name – The Shepherds' Trust.

Donating online through a secure server is an option for those donors who prefer to give through our web site at www.shepherdstrust.org

2. Bequests

A bequest is a specific provision in your will, directing various estate assets to be given to The Shepherds' Trust in return for a tax receipt for the full value of the bequest. This receipt can be used to reduce the tax payable on your final tax return and on the return of the previous year up to 100% of your net income.

These gifts can symbolize permanent memorials for you, your family or anyone you wish to honour.

3. Publicly Traded Stocks and Securities

Publicly traded stocks, bonds and other securities may also be gifted to The Shepherds' Trust. The tax on capital gains on publicly traded securities gifted to registered charities has been eliminated. Thus, donors will receive a tax receipt for the full amount of their charitable gift.

A Priestly Vocation

It was 1970 when Fr. Joseph Wasik came to Canada from Poland. The young priest didn't speak a word of English.

"When I came here, it was like going back to kindergarten," he says, recalling his abrupt transition from Polish preacher to fumbling Anglophone.

Despite the struggles, he left communist Poland resolute to never look back. He had waited three years for permission from his bishop to travel to Canada to visit his uncle. When he arrived, he made the decision to stay, even when he was discouraged from doing so by people he met in Canada and his bishop in Poland.

"They could kill me trying to take me back, but I would not go back alive."

What followed was a challenging journey to learn a new language and gain the necessary permissions to stay in Canada and continue serving in priestly ministry. Initially, he worked as an associate pastor in London, Ontario, where the bishop agreed to help Fr. Wasik remain in the country. He soon moved to Toronto so he could study English and further the education he had gained in Poland.

Although he found many friends and support in the Polish Catholic community in Toronto, he concentrated on bettering his language skills so he could be a pastor of an English parish. After serving in four parishes in the Archdiocese of Toronto, he was given the task of building a new parish in Mississauga.

"I did everything for the people. My passion was looking after the people."

"My baby was Merciful Redeemer Church. I started that parish from scratch with 80 families. The parish was growing so fast that in four years we raised \$3 million. After five years the church was built."

This active suburban parish provided a great place for Fr. Joseph to exercise his passion for pastoral work. With an active ministry to a hospital and a number of local Catholic schools, he lived those years of his priesthood serving the people of a growing community.

As much as he loved being involved in its growth, being pastor of Merciful Redeemer was a tiring job. For his final parish assignment, he was transferred to a smaller parish where he remained for 10 years before retiring in June 2013 at the age of 75. That year he celebrated his 50th anniversary as a priest.

In his retirement, he enjoys the time he has to rest, to exercise and to continue his priestly ministry without the administrative duties of being a pastor.

His priestly vocation is one marked by many years of hard work. For Fr. Joseph, it all comes down to service.
