3.	What factors might contribute to 2 people having a positive experience of sexual intercourse? Give three answers.	This question is a comparative one for pre and post program, so that students can judge if their beliefs have altered. Young people who enjoyed their last sexual experience were more likely to say they were in a relationship, felt ready and weren't pressured into it, both wanted sex; were able to talk to each other; had trust; felt safe. 5.	<p>Gina has been with 2 boys this month. Tom has been with 2 girls this month. Gina is getting called negative names by some people at school, like 'slut'. Tom is not. In fact, he is seen as a bit of a hero.</p> <p>Why do you think the boy and the girl have been labeled differently for doing the same thing?</p>	<p>This question is a comparative one for pre and post program, so that students can judge if their beliefs have altered. Answers could include: recognises stereotypes as a negative or 'unfair'. Young people often use the term 'double standards.'</p>	No score
6.	<p>Which graph correctly shows how many people have had sex by the time they finish Year 12?</p>	<p>b) Never had sex – 50%; had sex – 50%</p>	1
7.	<p>Some people have sex that they describe as 'unwanted' sex. What do you think are the top 3 reasons for unwanted sex?</p>	<p>The research tells us that pressure from a partner; alcohol; being forced or frightened are the top 3. 'Being out of it' is also often cited.</p>	Possible 3

Name two things or signs you notice when they are really paying attention to you.</p>	<p>Active listening skills such as making eye contact (if culturally appropriate); open body language; taking time; nodding; paraphrasing to check for understanding; not interrupting.</p>	2
