



Tips for a Successful Boarding Stay

To make your pup's stay as stress-free and enjoyable as possible, we will meet with you when you come in to go over diet, medications, and any special instructions. Don't forget your completed **Boarding Application & Contract** and vaccination records for rabies, distemper, and bordetella (kennel cough).

Packing List

Please make sure to pack the following items for your dog:

- Food
- Toy(s)
- Blanket or clothing item with a scent of home
- Chew (such as a rawhide, etc.) and snacks
- Medication (if needed)

You do not need to bring food or water bowls, unless they are specifically to slow food consumption.

Food

We are happy to feed your dog kibble, canned food, and refrigerated or frozen items. Unfortunately, we do not have the ability to cook meals. Please call us to discuss any special diet restrictions.

Pre-measure your dog's food and place each meal in a Ziploc bag. Prepackaging eliminates any confusion over different sized scoops, etc. Unless you are coming for an extended stay, please do not bring bags of kibble.

If your dog runs out of food, we will provide kibble of our choosing for an additional \$5 / day.

Medication

Please bring any medication that your dog will need in its original packaging. We will count out the necessary dosage for your dog's stay and return the rest to you. There is no extra charge for administering oral medications.

Dropping Off and Picking Up

You may drop off your dog at any time during the day, up until an hour before closing. There is no extra charge for early check-ins.

Plan to spend five to 10 minutes with us when dropping off your dog so that we can go over feeding instructions and discuss any concerns.

Pick-up time is noon. If you are not able to pick up your dog by noon, we will care for them until the end of the day for an additional half-day charge of \$13 / dog.
