### Background

## PDG Bonus Points for Coordinated Application, Eligibility, Enrollment:

 Develop a pilot or expand on an existing effort for coordinated application/enrollment or centralized eligibility, waitlist and enrollment systems development in order to make determinations that streamline enrollment for families who may be eligible for multiple public benefits.

## Colorado Shines Brighter Strategic Plan OBJECTIVE 1.2: Ensure Coordinated Services

 1.2.1: Study existing national and local models of coordinated enrollment/application and service navigation and identify recommendations for local implementation work.





## Proposed State Definition of Coordinated Eligibility and Enrollment Work for PDG

In Colorado, coordinated eligibility and enrollment work means developing information and tools to support local communities in streamlining information, processes, and navigation across entities and/or programs of their choosing to ensure families can more easily access their desired suite of early childhood care and education services.

The suite of early childhood care and education services includes: early education programs in the mixed delivery system, as well as other services, such as Parts B & C of the IDEA, home visiting, and parenting supports.

  - increasing understanding of Colorado's informal child care providers
- PDG B-5 partnered with the Butler Institute for Families to conduct the analysis and author each report
