

DIRECTORS' STATEMENTS

JIM CAVE | The Night the New Jesus Fell to Earth

Ron Rash was 41 by the time his first collection of stories, *The Night New Jesus Fell to Earth*, was published. He started writing the "Cliffside Stories" at 21, threw the manuscript in a dumpster, rewrote the first story from memory, and, by the time he was 30, had largely finished a series of linked stories about the community of Cliffside, North Carolina. He had always admired *Winesburg*, *Ohio* by Sherwood Anderson: "how those interwoven tales give the satisfaction of individual stories, yet, ultimately, also a novelistic sense of a particular place." Rash's collection sat in his dresser drawer for 10 years as his focus turned to poetry, until a publisher voiced interest in his fiction. *The Night the New Jesus Fell to Earth* was finally published in 1994.

Tonight, you're getting a chance to see the title story: a glimpse into the "fallen world" of the Cliffside Baptist Church, the foibles of its congregation, and how it got itself, in the words of Preacher Thompson, "...back in gear." Maybe it will prompt you to pick up a copy of Rash's book and read more?

Sam Shepard once told me that every story needs a home run in it. Ron Rash is a major league slugger. The first time I read Ron Rash, I felt I had discovered a writer on par with John Steinbeck. Rash's focus on place, poverty, love and grief, set deep in America, caught and pulled at me. His imagery, his stunning, powerful ability as a writer totally knocked me out.

We know that stories have the power to place us in lives not our own. We know that stories let us walk in another's shoes, to see through another's eyes, to feel what it might mean to be "the other." Ron Rash's work does not shy away from uneasy truths. His characters wrestle with loss, poverty, the weight of history, and circumstance. Also within these stories there is always humanity—humor, tenderness, resilience.

By being together in this theater and by seeing ourselves reflected and transformed onstage, we begin to imagine the possibility of connection in a world that so often insists on division. Tonight, as you leave Z Below, we hope you carry with you both the struggles of Rash's characters and the knowledge that storytelling remains one of our strongest tools for shaping a more compassionate future.

RON RASH


Best known as a chronicler of the residents, culture, and history of rural Appalachia, Ron Rash is critically acclaimed for his skillful, perceptive portrayal of the everyday lives of people in the region. In his poetry, short stories, and novels, he pays homage to their vital connection to the past and their struggles to preserve their cultural roots despite sweeping economic and social change, displacement, marginalization, and environmental degradation.

Rash's writings focus on family conflicts, the challenges encountered by working-class people, the pressures of the past upon the present, and the splendor and mysteries of nature.


A best-selling author with an international readership, Rash has been praised for his distinctive literary voice, consistent reexamination of regional stereotypes, and rendition of Appalachia's buried history.

Ron Rash is the author of the PEN/Faulkner finalist and New York Times bestselling novel Serena, in addition to the critically acclaimed novels The Caretaker, The Risen, Above the Waterfall, The Cove, One Foot in Eden, Saints at the River, and The World Made Straight. He is also the author of five collections of poems and seven collections of stories, among them Burning Bright, which won the 2010 Frank O'Connor International Short Story Award; Nothing Gold Can Stay, a New York Times bestseller; Chemistry and Other Stories, which was a finalist for the 2007 PEN/Faulkner Award; and In the Valley. He is a three-time recipient of the O. Henry Prize, and his books have been translated into 17 languages. He teaches at Western Carolina University.

DIRECTORS



Jim Cave (Director, The Night the New Jesus Fell to Earth; Production Lighting Designer) has worn many hats in his "theatrical career" but thinks of himself primarily as a collaborator. He has worked with many artists, composers, and companies over the past 45 years including Bob Ernst and the Blake Street Hawkeyes, Anna Halprin, Muth Zaporah, Margaret Fisher, Lauren Elder, Oliver DiCicco, Erling Wold, Intersection for the Arts, Deborah Slater Dance Theater, Eureka Theatre, Magic Theatre, and Aurora Theatre. He's worked with WFW for 25 years primarily as a lighting designer. His directing credits for the company includie Silence by Colm Toibin, and co-direction on Rime of the Acicent Mariner and Retablos. Thanks to Amy and the Company for bringing me onboard for Hard Times.



Amy Kossow (Director, Sad Man in the Sky and Hard Times) A Company Member of Word for Word since its inception, Amy has developed and directed award-winning new works based on the prose of Alan Bennett, Sam Shepard, Siobhan Fallon, Muriel Spark among others. As an actor and singer, she originated roles in premieres by Taylor Mac, Octavio Solis, and Linda McLean, and has appeared in many WFW productions over the years. Amy is the Co-Curator of Theater at The 222, a multi-art space in Healdsburg, where she will be directing plays by Athol Fugard and Lauren Gunderson in Spring 2026. Amy is also a Resident Director with the Actors' Reading Collective (ARC). With ARC, she will be directing the San Francisco premiere of Amy Herzog's Mary Jane, running in November at Magic Theatre. 

Greg Sarris was instrumental in helping his people, the Coast Miwok and Southern Pomo of Northern California, gain federal recognition. On Dec 27, 2000, the Federated Indians of Graton Rancheria became the last tribe in the United States to be restored by an act of Congress. FIGR went on to use the opportunity and reparations from that recognition to create the Graton Resort and Casino in Rohnert Park. In addition to providing programs and services to Tribal Citizens to realize their dreams of self-sufficiency, the resort itself has a forward thinking design, with sustainability in mind. The employees receive some of the best pay and benefits for service workers in the county, and the Tribe has created an organic garden onsite at the resort that feeds local elders.
