Luther on Baptism and the Sacrament of the Altar by Pastor Schumacher

Now the month of the celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation has begun. On October 31st, we celebrate the start of the Reformation, which was October 31, 1517. For your benefit I would like to highlight important aspects of Luther's theology for your benefit. Last week, I wrote about Martin Luther and Prayer. This week I want to write to you about Martin Luther and **Baptism and the Sacrament of the Altar**.

What I love about Luther is that he is so clear from Scripture on what Baptism and the Sacrament of the Altar are and what are the benefits: *What is Baptism?* Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word. *What benefits does Baptism give?* It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

What is the Sacrament of the Altar? It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink. *What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?* These words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that in the Sacrament for-

giveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation.

Luther knows from Scripture that Baptism and the Sacrament of the Altar are gifts given by Christ for our salvation. They are means of grace—means by which Christ's salvation is brought to us. Martin Luther clearly shows us that Baptism and the Sacrament of the Altar are totally gifts of Christ for forgiveness of sins and salvation. Neither are dependent on our work; they are dependent on Christ's promise. Therefore they are sure. Therefore they are the greatest treasures.

Luther knew that Sacraments were gifts given for our salvation. So Luther clearly confessed the gift nature of Baptism and the Sacrament of the Altar in the Catechism. This month as the 500th anniversary of the Reformation approaches, it would be great if you read through the entire Small Catechism. There you will see how clearly Baptism and the Sacrament of the Altar are taught, as well as the other chief parts of the faith. Luther's teaching on these gifts is excellent. The gifts are priceless. Praise God for salvation given through baptism and the Sacrament of the Altar.
