The Living Word by Pastor Schumacher

What would a cancer patient say if a drug company invented a drug guaranteed to adhere to any cancer cell and kill it, although it might be painful? And the same drug was able to repair any organ damaged by the cancer cells? And the drug was inexpensive and completely reliable? Would the cancer patient take such a drug? Of course the patient would. Who wants cancer cells in their body? Who does not want damaged organs restored?

Hebrews 4:12 says, *“For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.”* The Word of God is unique. The Word of God is living and active. The Holy Spirit uses the Word to cut the heart and convict of sin. The Holy Spirit uses the Word of God to create and sustain faith. The Word of God is living and active.

It was by the Word that the heavens and the earth were created. Look at Genesis 1. Over and over again, you see “And God said...” God spoke and the creation was made. Since the Fall, God wants a new creation. He wants us to be saved. So the Holy Spirit works through the Word to create and sustain faith. Romans 10:17 says, *“So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.”* God desires that we be His. He makes us His own through the Word, the living and active Word. Look at the

Catechism. We confess that it is the Word that gives both Baptism and the Lord’s Supper the power to bring us forgiveness of sins.

We often think that because we know some Bible passages and know the basic outline of some Bible stories that we do not need to read the Bible. That comes from a false view of the Word that treats the Bible the way we treat a textbook or a newspaper story. No, the Word of God is living and active. The Word of God is necessary for our daily life as a Christian.

Often the Word is painful. The Word of Law is painful as our old sinful self does not want to fear, love, and trust in God above all things. Living in a pagan world, it is easy to look at aspects of life as the world does, and to fall into sin. The Word of Law is necessary to convict us of our sin, or that sin would cause us to lose salvation. The Word can be painful as it convicts us of sin so that the sin could be repented of and forgiven just as it is painful for the cancer to be identified and removed.

More than pain, though, the Word of God brings pure joy. The Word creates and sustains faith in Jesus Christ. The Word brings salvation and healing to our souls. The Word creates and sustains hope. The Word is living and active and gives us eternal life. Rejoice in the Word. Know that the Word is living and that you need the Word for your life and for the life of your children and family.
