

Instructions Choose 5 fabrics: I used white, grey, black, and a light and dark red. This block is pieced in columns (as opposed to rows). All Seam allowances are 1/4". *Note about pressing if you are making 4 or more blocks: I wait to press steps 5 & 7 until step 9 so I can nest the seams when sewing the blocks together.

Cutting & Assembly Instructions for one block
12 1/2" block (12" finished)

*You may prefer to cut longer strips and subcut into smaller sections.

-  Fabric A (White): Cut (2) 5 1/2" x 11" strips.
-  Fabric B (Grey): Cut (2) 1 1/2" x 5 1/2" strips.
-  Fabric C (Black): Cut (3) 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares
-  Fabric D (Red): Cut (2) 1 1/2" x 5 1/2" strips.
-  Fabric E (dk Red): Cut (1) 1 1/2" x 11" strip.

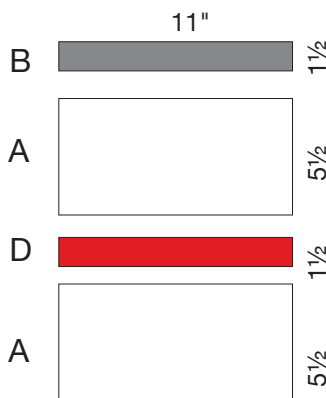
Cutting Instructions for 4 blocks

One 24" section of the Bespoke BOM *combine measurements to cut longer pieces and subcut the strips.

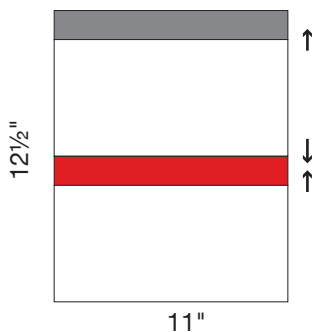
-  Fabric A (White): Cut ((8) 5 1/2" x 11" strips.
-  Fabric B (Grey): Cut (8) 1 1/2" x 5 1/2" strips.
-  Fabric C (Black): Cut (12) 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares
-  Fabric D (Red): Cut (8) 1 1/2" x 5 1/2" strips.
-  Fabric E (dk Red): Cut (4) 1 1/2" x 11" strips.

Section 1

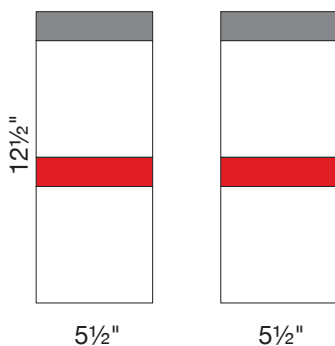
1. Sew a B strip to an A Strip and a D strip to an A strip.



2. Sew together. Press in the direction of arrows.

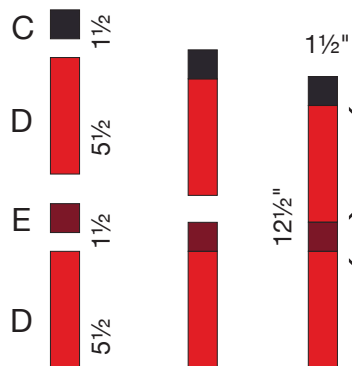


3. Subcut into (2) 5 1/2" sections.

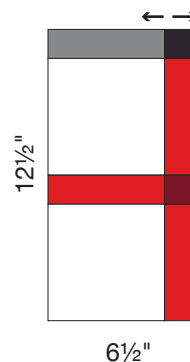
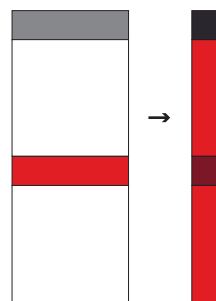


Column 1

4. Make a C/D set and an E/D set and sew them together into a strip. Press in the direction of arrows.

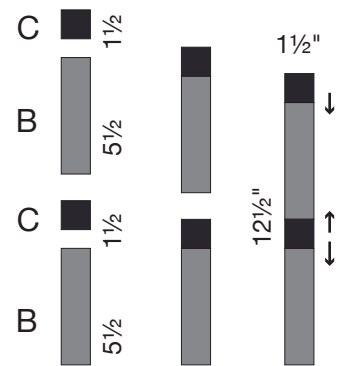


5. Sew the C/D/E/D strip to a Section 1 unit. Press open or wait to press*.

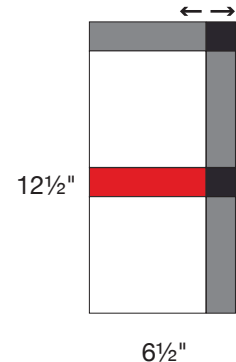
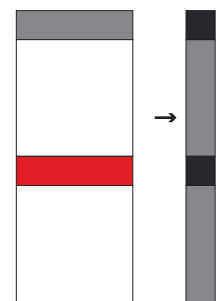


Column 2

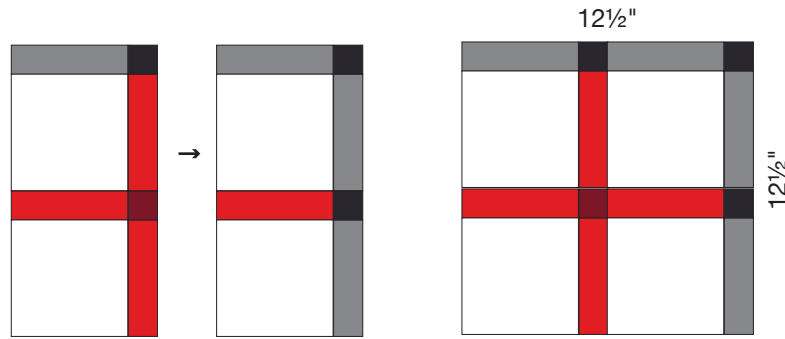
6. Make (2) C/B units and sew them together into a strip. Press in the direction of arrows.



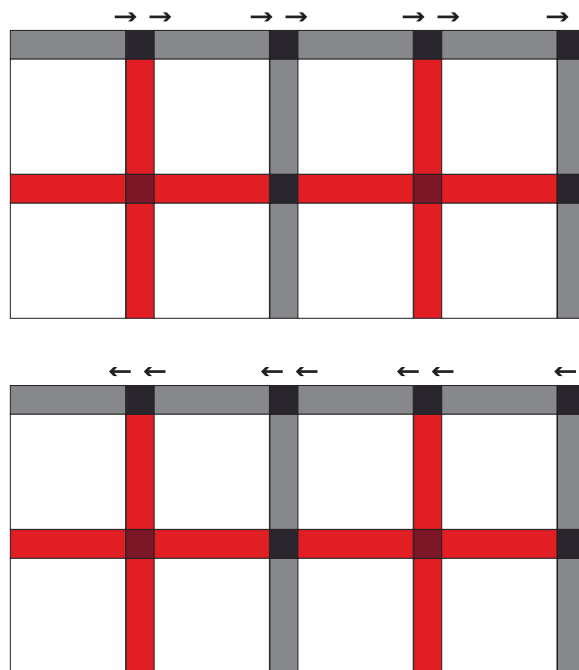
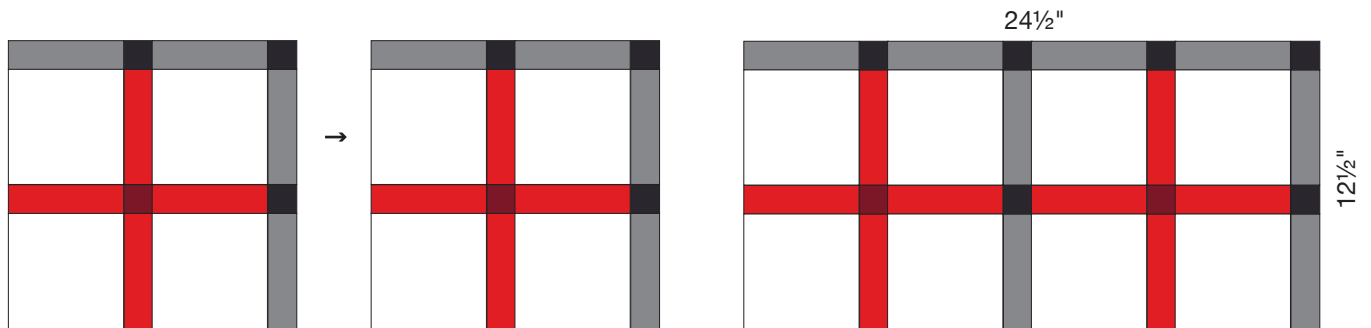
7. Sew the C/D/E/D strip to a Section 1 unit. Press open or wait to press*.



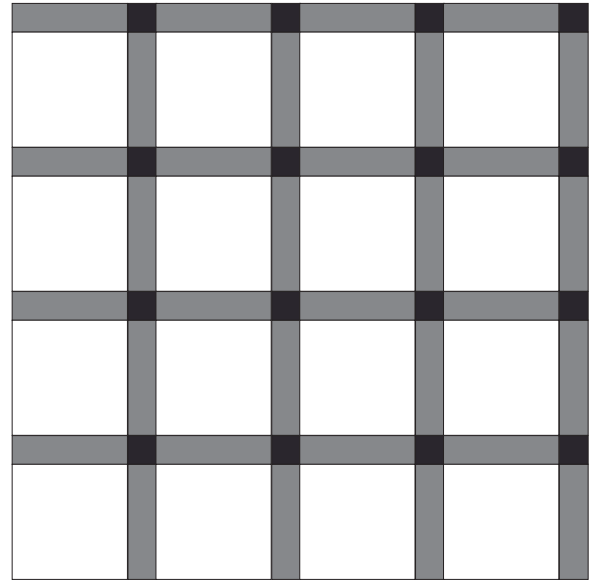
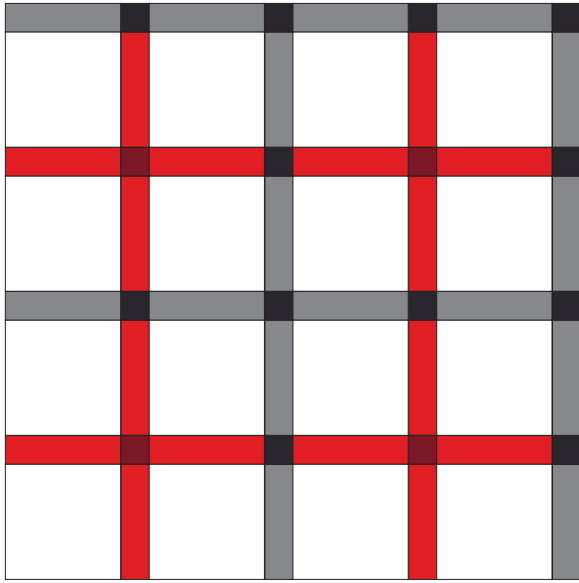
8. Sew a Column 1 unit to a Column 2 unit to make a Tattersall Block. This will measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished (12" finished).



9. For sewing 4 or more blocks together: assemble your blocks into rows. Press the seam allowances open, or to nest your seams, press the rows in opposite directions as illustrated below.

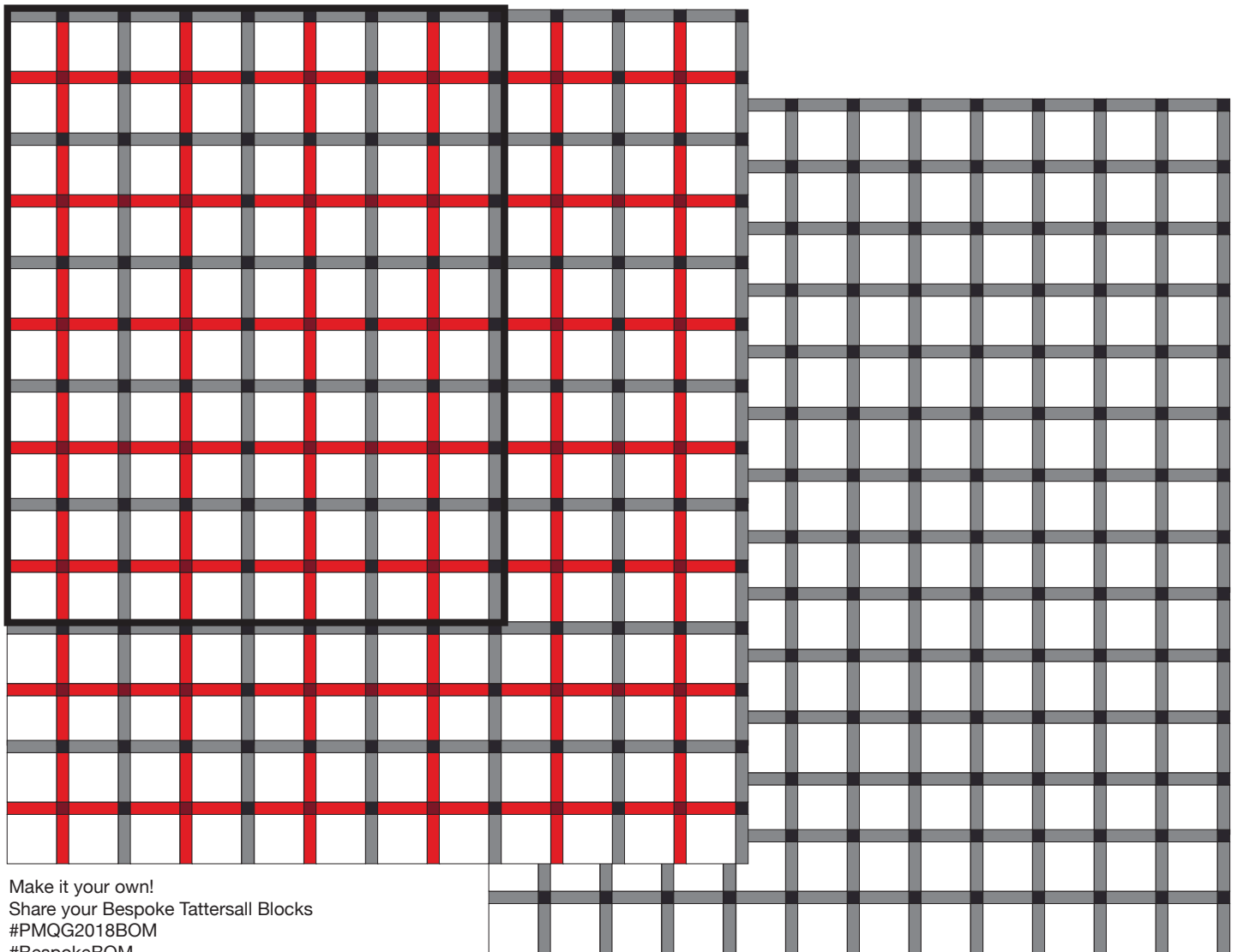


24½" x 24½" unfinished.
