

OUR STORY SO FAR



In 2003 the Tom Bass Sculpture Studio School became a not-for-profit Incorporated Association and a registered charity. In 2024, the Tom Bass Sculpture Studio School continues to develop a range of innovative and challenging programs which fulfil our core values of upholding the traditions of sculpture, the promotion of public sculpture and being a viable and vital part of the community. We are proud to be celebrating the wonderful milestone of 50 years of providing high quality tuition and inspiration to thousands of students since those humble beginnings in 1974. **Tom Bass AM (1916 - 2010)** created sculptures that were placed in the public domain - his sculptures connected with the people and can be seen in numerous educational institutions (UNSW, University of Sydney) and also in many prominent public spaces - for instance, the Lintel Sculpture above the entrance of the National Library in Canberra. Central to this was Bass' great sense of community and the desire to communicate values and ideas into sculpture for them.

Tom Bass was taught to draw by Antonio Dattilo-Rubbo (1870-1955) within a traditional 'masterapprentice' relationship and learned sculpture at the National Art School after WWII. In 1974, after nearly 30 years as a public sculptor, Tom founded his independent sculpture studio-school with the aim of teaching the fundamental principles, ideas and concepts vital to this tradition. Tom set up his Sculpture School in a warehouse loft overlooking Broadway. It remained there until 1998, when redevelopment forced Tom to move his Studio School to Erskineville. This is where the Studio remains today with the continued support of the City of Sydney. Although Tom passed away in 2010, his traditions and teachings have lived on through the community of teachers and students that learnt from Tom and continue to attend the Studio today.




