


Tapestry with Lady and Attendant Hawking

This tapestry, made of wool and silk, was woven in Belgium sometime between 1500-1510. In it we can see two people hawking, which is hunting using birds of prey. One is a fashionably dressed woman and the other is her male attendant. They are both riding horses. Three hounds race along the ground near the horses, and two others with a pup rest in the foreground. There are two falcons - one on the woman's gloved hand, and one perched in a fruit tree.

Tapestry of Shepherd and Shepherdess with a Woodcutter

This tapestry is also made of wool and silk, and was woven in Belgium sometime between 1500-1510. In it we can see a shepherdess and shepherd in the bottom right corner. The shepherdess is seated and has a knife and fruit in her lap. On the left is a woodcutter, tying up a bundle of wood. The scenery includes fruiting trees, lilies, roses and other flowering plants.




