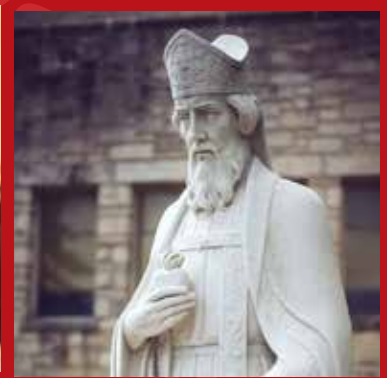

Annual Report that the Midwest Augustinians are doing well and have indeed made progress in several areas in the past year. Of course, we could not have done so without your prayers and support.

There are some great new developments that you will read about in this report that I wish to highlight:

- I am most pleased with the continued success we are experiencing in attracting young men to join the Order. We had our first ordinations to the priesthood in fifteen years. This, in the long run, will benefit all of our apostolates,
- We continue to honor the Covenant of Care for our elderly and infirm friars and have made the move to St. Anthony Home in Indiana to assure them of private rooms at all levels of care and a supportive community to be with them,
- We continue to support our missions in Peru and their desire to become an independent province by purchasing land, with the help of the other U.S. provinces, for them to build a school which will in turn give them teaching and administrative salaries, and
- Of course, our parishes and schools continue to do great ministry!

In Advancement we had a 9% increase in donors and held a successful inaugural gala, honoring three great Augustinians: Bishops John McNabb, O.S.A. and Dan Turley O.S.A. and Fr. Bob Prevost, O.S.A. who just completed twelve years as our Prior General. We also relaunched the midwestaugustinians.org website, established the Fr. Ray Ryan, O.S.A. Trust to honor the memory of Fr. Ray Ryan, O.S.A., and conducted a professional study leading toward the Province's largest capital campaign ever!

I hope you will recognize that this annual report is one way that we strive to be both accountable and transparent. It is a hallmark of our stewardship for all those who share with us in prayer, volunteering, and charitable gifts. Thank You for being partners with us in ministry as we continue our journey of faith together. May God Bless You for your generosity.

Formation and Vocations Outreach

It is with a grateful and joyful heart that I present this Province Update on Vocations and Formation. A year ago, I told you about the increase in the number of men in formation and in discernment. I had good news then, and I have even better news now. I believe there are two reasons for that. One of those reasons is the prayers of our friends and benefactors. I know you have all been asked to pray for vocations and your prayers have been very fruitful. Another reason is that many young men are drawn to Augustine, to his spirituality and to our Augustinian way of life – particularly our commitment to living in community, to developing our prayer life, and to our diverse ministries.

We depend on your prayers and, most especially, the prayers of our elderly and infirm Augustinians, and we are convinced that our way of life is both tried and true, but, at the same time, we know we need to promote our Augustinian way of life, to make it known, and to present it to young men who may be discerning religious life.

This past fall we initiated a program which we called “A Culture of Vocations.” In November 2012, we had 33 men in various stages of formation. We printed posters with photos of the men, the phone numbers, websites and email addresses of the Vocation Directors in the United States and Canada, and, an illustration of St. Augustine with these words from the Confessions: “Strengthen me, Lord, that I may have your strength. Give me the grace to do what you command, and command me to do whatever you want.” These posters were distributed to all our Augustinian parishes and schools as well as to any other places where our Friars are doing ministry in mid-November. Pastors were asked to

preach on vocations on the weekend of November 17th and 18th, the weekend closest to the Feast of All Saints of the Augustinian Order. In addition, posters were included with other mailings. I left stacks of them at parishes/schools where I gave parish missions, gave presentations, etc. I have received very positive feedback about this program and I expect to repeat it this fall.

A second effort towards contacting more young men and introducing them to our way of life was having an Augustinian Exhibit Table at the annual FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students) conference in January. This conference, which was appropriately called "SEEK," was held in Orlando, Florida from January 2-6, 2013. Two of our professed students, one pre-novice and one young man who is entering this August assisted me at this exhibit. We contacted hundreds of young

people and seven of them have since either come to visit, made our bi-annual Discernment Retreat, or kept in touch through email or phone. That conference was definitely a very positive experience for me and for the four men who were with me.

And so, I am more than happy to tell you that, at this time, we have four young men from the Midwest Province in our Pre-Novitiate Program at Bellessini Friary in Ardmore, Pennsylvania. Two of these men are already college graduates and are taking some postgraduate courses at Villanova University. The other two have had two years of college and are continuing their college studies at Villanova. We have two novices from our Province at the Augustinian Novitiate in Racine, Wisconsin. There are six men in simple vows. Two, who are already ordained, are in ministry. The other four are living community at St. Augustine

Friary and studying at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago.

On June 8, 2013, two men, Father Robert and Father Homero, were ordained to the priesthood at St. Rita Parish in Chicago. These were our first ordinations in fifteen years! As you can well imagine, this was a day of great rejoicing for the Province, for our two newly ordained priests, and for their families.

But we do not rest on our laurels. We keep in touch through email and phone, with 20 young men, most of whom are in college, who are in the discernment process. Four of those have indicated that they will apply for the 2014 pre-novitiate.

I am grateful to all of you for your prayers, your encouragement and your commitment to the Augustinians. I send a heartfelt "Thank You" and "God Bless You" to each of you.

Care for Retired and Infirm Augustinians

We are in our fourth year of senior care at Franciscan Village in Lemont, Illinois and almost one year at St. Anthony's in Crown Point, Indiana. I, Father Mike O'Connor, O.S.A., am the coordinator for these two programs and also guide the friars in the Province who may need a health care program. These years have been a blessing and an ongoing challenge to meet the needs of our friars being served.

We have two friars at Franciscan Village in assisted living: Fathers Dan Hartigan, O.S.A. and Jack Gavin, O.S.A. Up until November 5th, we had two friars in skilled care: Fathers Frank Lawlor, O.S.A. and Ron Turcich, O.S.A. (both shared the same room). Father Lawlor died the morning of November 5th and Father Turcich followed six days later

on November 11. Both of their deaths were sudden and they died peacefully in their sleep. We also had two other men in the Province die this year: Father John FitzGerald, O.S.A. and Father Theodore Tack, O.S.A. While they all are certainly at peace and at home with the Lord, they have left a void for those who loved them and cared for them.

At St. Anthony's in Crown Point, Indiana, we have two friars in the care facilities: Father John Flaherty, O.S.A. and Brother Angelo Sturn, O.S.A. They have both adjusted well to their new surroundings and have found the staff and residents to be as generous and helpful as those at Franciscan Village. There are also three friars living on the grounds in the former convent: Brother Jerome Sysko, O.S.A., Father John Flynn, O.S.A., and Brother Mark Emken, O.S.A. They are the care giving community who minister to our friars at St. Anthony's. All the friars, both those in need of care and caregivers, are part

of the Blessed Stephen Bellisini Community. The two friars at Franciscan Village are also part of this community and are being served by two of our brothers living off sight: Brother David Adelsbach, O.S.A. and Brother Larry Sparacino, O.S.A. They alternate days in being present to our men at the Village.

St. Anthony's in Crown Point will be our care facility into the future for the Province membership. Some benefits of this facility are that private rooms are available for all levels of care and that the Franciscan hospital is situated on the campus.

Our friars in care and the caregivers are happy with their surroundings and the ongoing attention to their needs. Fellow Augustinians and many alumni from St. Rita and Mendel come to visit our men and show their appreciation for the impact the Augustinians have made in their lives. They are a great witness to our Augustinian charism of community and service.

Missions in Peru

Our missionary Chulucanas Vicariate in Peru currently has 24 Augustinians in solemn vows in different ministries. Each of us is responding to the needs of the times in Northern Peru and making the Kingdom of God become more present in our country. This year, we have 18 men in formation in simple vows, three taking their pastoral year, three novices, 12 pre-novices, and six more in discernment. These men come from all different parts of Peru. The monthly cost of educating one of these men in formation is \$650, and we can educate them all thanks to the generosity of the donors in the United States.

This year, with the help of God and many supporters, we opened our new school Colegio San Agustín (St.

Augustine High School) with 22 children in a neighborhood that the Archbishop of Trujillo asked us to start. We have purchased, with the help of many donors in the United States, over seven square acres of land, costing \$900,000. This project is just beginning, as we still need to construct the building and ask for the generosity of many people.

Our parish Nuestra Señora de la Asunción (Our Lady of the Assumption) in Pacaipampa, Peru is one of the poorest in our Diocese of Chulucanas. We recently started a student cafeteria where 50 poor students can eat so that they may attend grade school. The parish also supports their health needs, to which

the students would otherwise have no access.

This year, the Archbishop of Trujillo also offered us the opportunity to administer at Parroquia Nuestra Señora de Montserrat (Our Lady of Montserrat Parish). We are happy to have taken on this parish, even though the parish had no rectory at the time. Thanks be to God and to the parishioners, we were able to construct one by October 20. God has blessed us with this house and reinforced our faith!

This year, Parroquia San José Obrero (St. Joseph the Worker Parish) has connected with many of our youths thanks to the efforts and charisma of our Brother José Manuel, O.S.A. Through him and others in the community, they created many programs in the many chapels of the parish to encourage and grow youth participation. The community also has helped children affected by HIV. We can only accomplish all of these services together as a Church and with the generosity of our many

supporters, such as those in the United States that are supporting our missions, the Augustinian Order, and the Church. The House of God will continue to proclaim the Word of Jesus Christ and make His peace known in today's world.

In the name of all my brothers that serve in this mission, we offer our immense gratitude and ask that you continue supporting our efforts in our missionary Vicariate in Peru. We count on your prayers.

Augustinian Education

The Augustinians of the Midwest Province of Our Mother of Good Counsel are working hard to sustain their five high schools. Recently I have had the good fortune to visit four of them in person, and as of this writing I've yet to visit Cascia Hall in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Villanova College, our school in King City, Ontario, Canada is doing

well. Their Head of School, Mr. Paul Paradiso has recently shifted the administrative model from Head of School to the President/Principal model, which is embraced by about 60% of all private Catholic high schools in the United States and Canada. The school is comfortable and making plans for additional building improvements. Our Canadian brothers and sisters are

eager and delighted to learn more about Augustinianism and the Order of St. Augustine.

St. Rita of Cascia High School in Chicago is engaged in strategic planning, looking for ways to increase its enrollment, and prepare for the long-range future. St. Rita has recently completed the McCarthy Center as a student commons area and is now in the process of wrapping up a project to totally renovate the library and media center.

Providence Catholic High School in New Lenox, Illinois has begun the search for a new Principal to replace the retiring Principal, Mr. Don Sebestyen. Providence is also involved in strategic planning this year, as its cycle must be renewed. Providence hopes to thoroughly renovate the women's locker rooms as a major building renovation in the summer of 2014.

I recently returned from a three day visit to Austin Catholic Academy in Ray, Michigan. Twenty-seven young men and women are receiving an Augustinian education in a building which was a former public middle school. These young people and

their faculty are inspiring examples of commitment and dedication to Catholic Augustinian education. Please keep Austin Catholic Academy in your prayers and thoughts.

Our schools provide quality education in the Augustinian

tradition to these young people and to future generations of students.

Recently the Augustinian Secondary Education Association met in San Diego, California for a three day workshop. The Augustinians have a total of eight schools nationwide and

one in Canada. These schools work together to stage the Augustinian Values Institute and the Students Augustinian Values Institute, both of which emphasize our core values of truth, unity, and love and instruct both faculty and students in how to direct an Augustinian School.

PROVINCE UPDATE

Parish Ministry

Today Augustinian Friars are present at two parishes in Canada, five in Illinois, two in Michigan and one in Wisconsin. Given the realities of our aging membership, it is likely that there will be a reduction in the Province commitment to some of these parishes in the near future. If there is no Augustinian able to serve as pastor at one of these parishes, that parish will have to be returned to its Diocese. The priority of the Province will be to maintain parish commitments in the Chicago area and at St. Rita Parish in Racine, since it is the site of our Novitiate. Recently, the Province gave up its commitment to St. Clare of Montefalco in Grosse Pointe, Michigan and St. Peter Parish in Douglas, Michigan; however it had taken on a commitment to St. Gabriel Parish on the Southside of Chicago.

Currently we have approximately 22 active men in parishes that are listed in our 2013 Province Directory (this includes the Province of Canada). These 22 men reflect a combined number of full-time parish priests as well as part-time or semi-retired men in residence at various parishes. The parishes we serve are mainly a

middle to lower income population. The diversity in race, culture, and ethnicity are basically found in the Chicago area. In the lower income parishes, there are already existing as well as developing programs organized to address the inner-city needs such as housing foreclosures, immigration, neighborhood safety, and educational programs serving a population negatively affected by these issues. Several of the parishes have resourceful programs to immediately help the needy.

St. Turibius and St. Rita Parishes in Chicago continue to serve multi-lingual communities (English, Polish, Spanish). The Hispanic population continues to remain a significant factor for these parishes because of the demographics. They are the fastest growing ethnic group in the Archdiocese of Chicago. These two Chicago parishes within proximity of

each other offer hope of promoting Hispanic vocations to the Order.

Our veteran parish priests continue to age and will be facing at least semi-retirement as the years progress. Yet, our younger newly ordained men (June 2013) offer a newer vitality to the parishes to which they are assigned. We have other younger men in formation who have expressed a future interest in Parish Ministry. In order to ensure that we continue to offer parochial ministry as an option to our men we may need to think and respond to these needs creatively. At one of the recently past Pastor's Forum meetings, the pastors present discussed the idea of area ministry as a possibility rather than taking on parishes as traditional pastors. Offering ourselves to pastoral service without administrating may be a more viable option for the Friars. This needs further exploration and study.



PROVINCE ADVANCEMENT REPORT

Our Philosophy and Principles

The past year we witnessed great growth in our fundraising efforts. We also have been reminded of some important lessons:

- That the best charitable gifts are the fruits of strong relationships that are based on love, respect, and trust – for what the Augustinians have done and will do in the future - and upon a shared vision of what is truly good,
- That daily prayer and love of God are foremost prerequisites for any real Christ-centered charity,
- That our fundraising works best when it enjoys the active support of the Augustinians, our volunteer leaders, and our donors, and
- That our supporters believe that the works of the Augustinians serve God and all of us in infinite, long-lasting ways – we have a mission that matters and makes a difference in the lives of many.

Highlights of 2012-2013:

Working with the Province’s new strategic plan, our auditors, and finance people, we were able to devise a solid financial picture and project our resource needs through 2016. This resulted in establishing these goals for the Province:

- Our body of donors grew by 9% to over 1,400,
- The number of donors contributing \$3 a day (\$1,000+ a year) is now at 159 – up 36% since one year ago,
- Over 28 people indicated that the Augustinians are in their estate plans,
- Our inaugural Gala, the largest fundraising event in the Province’s 108-year history, attracted 462 guests and raised almost \$250,000 gross,
- The communications efforts – newsletters, publications, annual report, and the revitalized website – are drawing more interest and support than ever before, and
- More volunteers such as the Augustinian seminary alumni and high schools’ alumni have pitched in to help us.

Our major goals for 2013-2014:

With great leadership from the Augustinians, from the laity and supporters like you, we expect to:

- Launch the largest capital campaign in the Midwest Augustinians’ 108-year history - for the trusts which help to fund men in formation, vocations outreach, and our retired and infirm Augustinians,
- Grow our family of contributing donors to over 2,500,
- Conduct the second annual Gala – April 25, 2014, and
- Grow the annual fund to new levels (donors and dollars) for the support of the Augustinians.

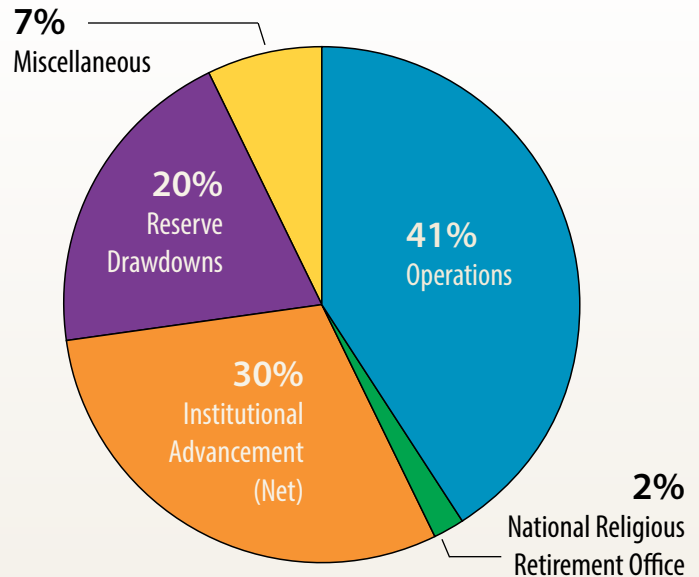

¹ One sale of assets, Tolentine Center, was not listed in this year's Province Revenues. Tolentine Center was initially the major seminary of the Midwest Province and later became both a care center for the retired and infirm Augustinians as well as the headquarters for the Province Offices. The building was sold in 2012 in order to both care for our retired men more effectively and also to streamline the Province Offices. The profit from the sale, \$1,809,300 will benefit the separately incorporated Fr. Ray Ryan, O.S.A. Trust for Men in Formations and Vocations Outreach in the 2013/2014 fiscal year.



² Institutional Advancement's net revenue grew from last fiscal year's amount of \$352,219, a 153% increase. The growth was due largely in part to the Advancement Office's programmatic development and focus on planned giving and major gifts.

³ Represents one-time insurance recovery payout.

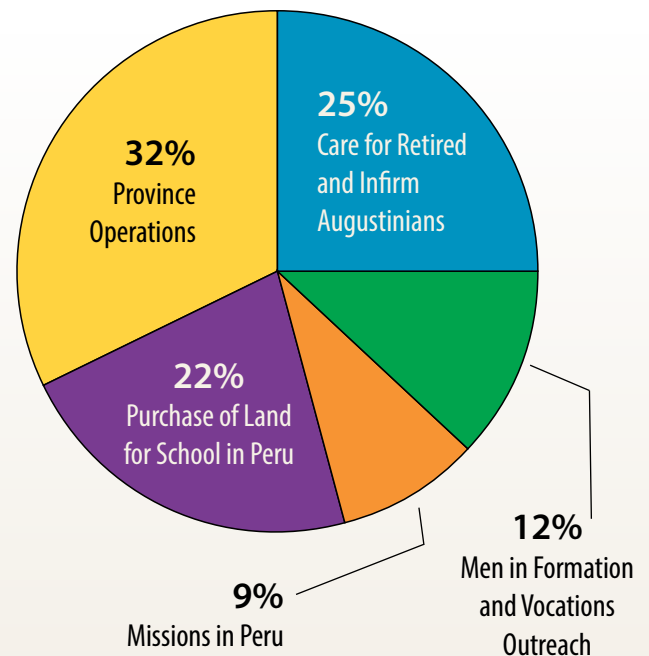
