DSD AC is committed to safeguarding children and young people. As an affiliated club of Athletics Ireland (AAI) we operate under their guidance, policies and Safeguarding Code. All our volunteers and staff working with children throughout the organisation, seek to create a safe environment for children and young people to participate in athletics.
