Students for a Sustainable Stanford (SSS) was founded in 2000 and is the largest sustainability group on campus. This year, we're working on five projects:

1. **Food Donation & Education:** Donate 40,000 pounds of food to local food banks by the end of the year, and create information materials for people trying to access local food resources.
2. **SCORE (Stanford Carbon Offsets to Reduce Emissions):** Improve Stanford Athletics' sustainability through carbon reduction measures, including offsets.
3. **Sustainability Education:** Improve the "Sustainability Manager" dorm position (an R&DE-funded staff role) by creating materials and metrics that aid in assessing and improving the Sustainability Manager role.
4. **Environmental Justice:** Raise awareness of environmental justice concerns and intersectional environmental issues through speaker events and trainings.
5. **General Use Permit:** Explore campus carbon neutrality by looking at implementation opportunities in the General Use Permit, a contract between Stanford and Santa Clara County that in the past has created significant environmental benefits.
