Dear Members,

I hope you have all enjoyed a great season!

The early snow at the end of May caught many off guard, but we were then kept waiting until mid-July for the next big dump. The falls in early August were such that last day of race week and the Thredbo Senior Interclub were cancelled. Overall, snow depths are looking similar to last season when there was plenty of snow remaining for cross-country skiing after the official season closes. For the adventurous, Southern Alps and Christiania Lodges will be open for self-catered bookings.

I thank those who have stepped up to cover the pre-season Committee resignations.

Sandy Brinkman is our new Public Officer, Kim Easdale has been joined by Duncan Sutherland as Acting Secretaries and Tim Easdale led the race week activities with help from Arthur Owens. Arthur also volunteered to look after the Senior Interclub team.

I am excited by the implementation of Clubman, a new membership and booking system created specifically for ski clubs. This new web-based system will replace the existing member database and booking databases, developed about 20 years ago by David Collett. The availability calendars and Mailchimp email service will also become superfluous. More detail on this page.

Subscriptions are now due. For the first time since 2003 we have increased fees by \$5 to reduce the effect of rising costs and the low interest rates now available for the Club's investments. Subscription notices will be sent shortly either by email or post. Payment through the new Clubman/Stripe payment gateway is preferred as this allows payments to be automatically receipted.

Applications for sponsorship have been received from Sami Kennedy-Sim and Theo Coates.

Sami is intending to continue her Ski Cross World Cup campaign with view to Olympic selection in 2022.

Theo is an aspiring FIS Alpine racer, looking to train and race in Europe to consolidate his position in the Australian team and the shadow Olympic team.

essed by our Sponsorship Committee and their recommendation will be considered at the September Club Committee meeting. We wish both Sami and Theo all the best for northern winter training and racing.

Further details will be emailed to members at the appropriate time and there will be regular updates posted on our website Bookings page.


