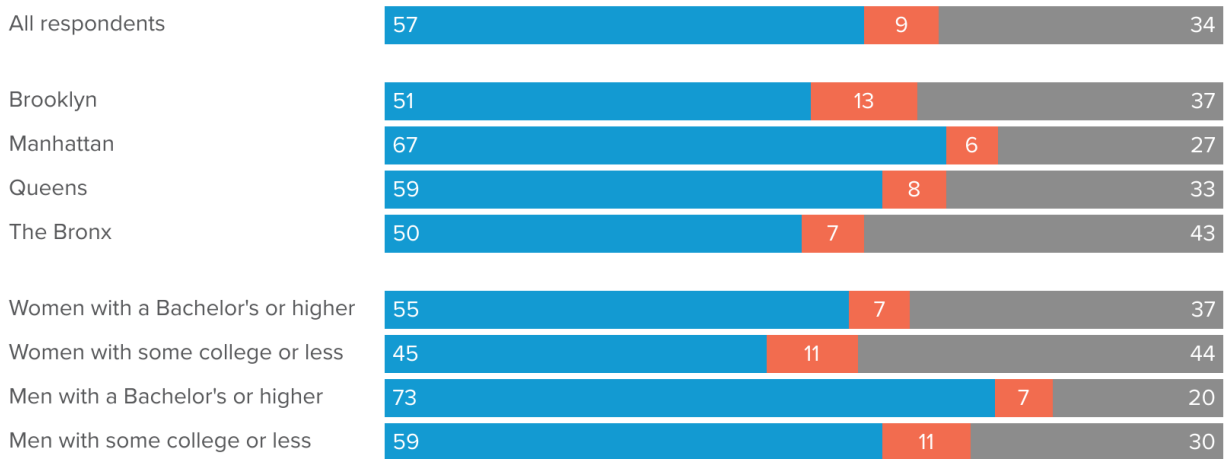
Democratic primary voters see tech as a positive influence in NYC

A new survey of 1137 likely Democratic primary voters finds that voters are largely supportive of the presence of tech companies in New York City, with 57% saying this industry has a positive impact. While a sizable 34% are unsure, only 9% think tech companies negatively impact the city.

Overall, would you say that the presence of tech companies in New York City has a mostly positive or mostly negative impact on the city?

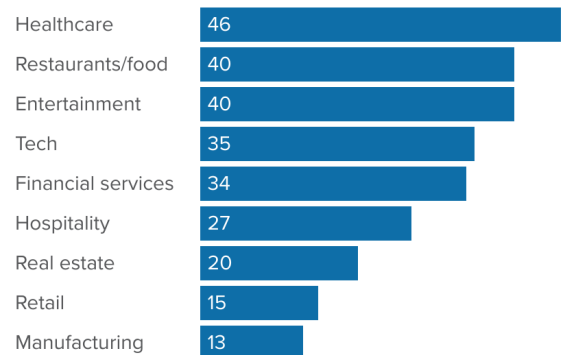

Voters also see tech as one of a number of key industries for the future of New York City. 35% identify tech as one of three industries they expect to be important to the city's future, behind healthcare, restaurants and food, and entertainment. Those who select tech tend to be college-educated (66%) and younger than voters overall (40% are under 50 vs. 32% overall). Of those who believe tech is important to the future of NYC, 42% also say financial services is important, along with 34% who say healthcare and 31% who say entertainment.
