From 15 April 2017, local volunteers will create raingardens by the Wulfstan Way shops. We will start by planting-up one of the grass swales (ditches) in front of the coffee shop with drought-tolerant plants that are good for wildlife. If this is a success, we will add other areas over the next year, including the two over-grown shrub beds.

Saturday Morning Raingardeners

Weather allowing, on the **first and third Saturdays of the month**, at least one volunteer from the project will be in the **space from 10 to 11am** to gather ideas, recruit volunteers and, on some weeks, we will have activities for people to join in. **The first planting session will be on Saturday 20 May from 10 am.**

We have two special sessions with the 28th Cambridge cubs and the RHS, to which local families are also invited – but please let us know in advance if you are coming:

- **Monday 24 April**, 6.45 to 7.45 pm, at Wulfstan Way: surveying the area and weeding
- **Monday 8 May**, 6.45 to 7.45 pm, at Nightingale garden: plant propagation

This is a Royal Horticultural Society (RHS)-supported youth project from RHS-affiliated Queen Edith's in Bloom, which is part of Queen Edith's Community Forum. Volunteers are working on this project with Cambridge City Housing and Cambridge City Council Streets and Open Spaces.
