 - Affordable Housing – Helping those who need lower rent.
 - Community Housing – Providing housing to qualified families and individuals with low to modest income.
 - Rent Subsidy – Providing rent assistance to tenants living in buildings owned by private landlords.
 - The HOME Program – Educating, advocating for and supporting low and moderate income households to become homeowners.
 - Crime-Free Multi-Housing – Collaborating with the Edmonton Police Service to provide a safer environment for our tenants.
 - Capital Region Housing Foundation – Hosting fundraising events in support of The HOME Program.
 - Supportive Housing – Providing a supportive housing environment to people who may need assistance to maintain their quality of life in the community.
- We engage and seek to understand our tenants and their specific needs so we can deliver solutions that meet those needs and enable them to contribute to the success of their communities.
- We work closely with like-minded organizations to do more together than we can do alone.
- We’ve established solid relationships with all levels of government and advocate to ensure social and affordable housing remains a priority when it comes to government planning.
- We are committed to a long-term vision and strategy to regenerate social housing properties and transform low-income communities.


