RoSPA Gold number 7

Lanes Group has achieved its seventh consecutive Gold Award in the RoSPA Occupational Health and Safety Awards 2016.

The accolade qualifies Lanes to receive a Gold Medal for achieving five or more consecutive Gold Awards. The awards, presented by the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents, are the UK's most prestigious occupational health and safety accolades.

Smile! It's a 360 record

Sector: Utilities Location: Brighton

A Lanes team has carried out its deepest ever survey of a sewer ventilation shaft using our revolutionary Panoramo SI camera.

It took less than an hour to complete a full inspection survey of the brick-lined shaft on Brighton seafront, even though it was 900mm wide and 21.5 metres deep. The IBAK Panoramo SI camera, thought to be the only one of its kind in the UK, generated a 360° high resolution image and a three-dimensional scan of the shaft under the A259 Marine Parade in Brighton, East Sussex.

Paul Purton, from Cappagh Browne Utilities, which commissioned the survey, said: "A confined-space entry wasn't feasible. The Panoramo SI was the optimum solution, both in terms of results achieved and cost-effectiveness."

200m UV liner record

Sector: Local Authority Location: Caerphilly

Lanes has installed its longest ultra violet light-cured pipe liner to date in a deep culvert considered at high risk of collapse.

The liner, which was 202 metres long and weighed 8 tonnes, was installed in a surface water culvert for Caerphilly County Borough Council, in South Wales.

The 750mm diameter concrete pipe under a park in Blackwood had been found to be badly cracked at a number of places along 150 metres of its length between two manholes.

Carl Bugler, Senior Assistant Engineer for the county borough council, said: "The Lanes Group team did a tremendous job. They had to overcome some major technical and operational challenges to complete the lining project within the two-week window that was open to them."


Bristol Royal Infirmary has used Lanes drainage expertise to investigate the health of drainage arteries running through and under its buildings.

As part of an £8m refurbishment programme, we carried out a comprehensive drainage survey across the site. A significant amount of the CCTV survey work was done at night to avoid disrupting patient care.

UV makes light of chemicals

In a double UK first, the Lanes Reline Division has carried out its first project to rehabilitate a pipe using a chemically-resistant ultra violet liner.

Three liners, all cured with ultra violet (UV) light, with a combined length of 200 metres, were installed at a plant run by Solutia UK, part of Eastman Chemicals, in Newport, South Wales.

It was also the first time Lanes supplier Reline Europe - a world leader in pipe relining systems – had supplied

a UV liner to provide chemical resistance in the UK. Solutia UK Engineering Manager David Davies said: "The UV lining solution identified by Lanes was ideal for us, given our production schedule. The lining team was well drilled, and clearly aware of safety requirements in a challenging situation."

Lanes Business Development Manager Damian Tranter said the success of the project demonstrates the resilience of UV liners and their viability across the chemicals industry."

FORS safety success

Lanes Group has achieved, through re-auditing, the Bronze accreditation for its UK transport fleet under the Fleet Operator Recognition Scheme (FORS).

The company first achieved FORS Bronze in 2014, and successfully passed its annual audit in March - demonstrating that it sets nationally-recognised safety and operational management standards. The FORS scheme is operated by Transport for London, but is increasingly used by fleet operators across the UK to benchmark standards.

During March, five different independent assessors audited five Lanes depots, in Eastleigh, Hampshire, Rainham, Essex, Leeds, Middlesbrough and Sheffield, with all five achieving FORS Bronze accreditation.

Paul McParland, Health, Safety Quality and Environment Manager for Lanes Group, said: "This gives our clients assurance about the quality they can expect from Lanes Group vehicles, drivers and operational systems."

Tonni said: "It's good to positively challenge your activity rates no matter how fit and healthy you think you are. It all helps improve your health and happiness."

Remember – watch this

Lanes operations manager Tony Moore is calling on TV viewers to watch a Channel 4 film, featuring his granddad as he served in The Forgotten Army during World War Two.

He hopes the documentary about a British Army campaign, called Calling Blighty, to send messages from the troops fighting in the Far East to families back home, will raise awareness of the sacrifice they made. Tony, who works at Lanes Leeds, describes the hourlong documentary as an emotional rollercoaster. At a media viewing arranged by Channel 4, which he attended, even the journalists cried.

Tony's grandfather, Frank Miller, served with an elite special forces brigade, called the Chindits. He was one of thousands of soldiers filmed in 1945 and 1946, giving personal messages to their loved ones, in the 70-year-old equivalent of a Skype call.

Tony's mother, Alma, remembers going to a cinema and seeing her dad's message when she was five. It was the first time she had seen him other than in a photograph.

Tony, who also served in the Army, said: We have a copy of my granddad's Calling Blighty message, which I can pass on to my grandchildren. He won't be forgotten in our family.





Investing for service
