\$645,000 GRANTED TO 24 ARTISTS and ORGANIZATIONS FOSTERING CROSS-SECTOR WORK IN COLORADO

Denver, CO: [Arts in Society](#) is a cross-sector grant program that seeks to support art projects that positively impact cross-sector initiatives, such as health, environment, and other human service programs statewide. Founded in 2017, this unique collaboration between Colorado funders and administered by RedLine Contemporary Art Center seeks to meet what is now over \$6 million in cross-sector grant requests across the state of Colorado each year. To-date, Arts in Society has granted over \$4 million for projects fostering cross-sector work and supporting the integration of arts and culture into multiple disciplines critical to the health and well-being of Coloradans.

24 projects were funded for amounts ranging between \$10,000-\$35,000 for the 2025 grant cycle, which will be announced and grantees will be acknowledged during RedLine's annual [EPIC Gala](#) on April 17, 2025.

From January 2025 to March 2025, a 14-member panel composed of individuals across the state of Colorado assembled to review over 387 grant applications. Grant applications were assessed based on the applicant's ability to illustrate artistic commitment, broaden the understanding of the role arts play in society, demonstrate cross-sector work, exhibit cultural relevance, foster community engagement, and present opportunities for shared learning. New grantees from across the state will join in a learning community cohort that will meet throughout the next year to share best practices, challenges, and opportunities related to their projects.

Lighting Up Denver's Chinatown - Colorado Asian Pacific United

Metro Denver Seven-County Region

Lighting Up Denver's Chinatown' serves as an act of cultural pride and reclamation, and will feature an installation of overhead lanterns designed by local AANHPI artists and community members in the alleyway that used to be the heart of Denver's Historic Chinatown which no longer exists.

Storytellers of the Ancestral Red Road - Storytellers of the Ancestral Red Road (SOAR)

Storytellers of the Ancestral Red Road is a collective of Indigenous teachers and allies working in multi-generational educational settings to promote ancestral wisdom, and cross-cultural healing through creative expression.

Creative Practices in Colorado Prisons - Coalition for Creative Practices in Colorado Prisons (CCPCP)

Colorado Department of Corrections Statewide

Our coalition of three nonprofits– ACT Ensemble, Impact Arts, and Unbound Authors– connects with the incarcerated community in the Colorado Department of Corrections through a myriad of creative activities, from play-building and performance, to writing workshops and anthology creation, to robust visual art classes.

La Sandia Project - Small Town Project

Arkansas Valley - Rocky Ford

The La Sandia Project is a dynamic community art initiative in Rocky Ford, Colorado, creating Colorado's largest watermelon sculpture, murals, and fruit art to celebrate agricultural heritage and cultural diversity, culminating at the Arkansas Valley Fair to promote inclusivity and economic growth.

Reframing Justice Narratives: A Colorado Comic Memoir Program - Brink Literacy Project

Metro Denver Seven-County Region

Reframing Justice Narratives unites justice-impacted adults across Colorado to create short comic memoirs about an important turning point in their lives. Our student storytellers embrace the power of their own stories to advocate for their futures, enable community healing, and gain a skillset spanning arts education, behavioral health, and social-emotional learning.

Increasing Water Awareness in Ouray, Colorado Through Cinema and Education - San Juan Film Institute (Ouray International Film Festival)

San Juan Region

Nearly 60% of Colorado's water leaves the state, yet many Coloradans are insufficiently informed about water scarcity, drought, and climate-driven shifts in our watersheds. Our film festival aims to reverse that trend in Ouray County by programming films, speakers, and community discussions that lead our community to identify pathways toward water conservation informed by our festival programming.

Escultura San Luis - Jacales Fine Art

San Luis Valley

Escultura San Luis is an outdoor sculpture exhibit showcasing sculptures in various mediums in San Luis. The project will educate about the acequia culture that has been in use for generations and continues to this day. The artwork will bring tourists to walk along Main Street to visit our businesses and learn about San Luis.

Globeville StoryWalk - Sidewalk Poets

Metro Denver Seven-County Region

The Globeville StoryWalk will amplify local voices in a public art-story installation and community walk around the neighborhood, featuring poems and stories on signs, wraps, murals and more--all written by community members at creative writing workshops hosted by Sidewalk Poets.

Unfiltered: Real Stories from the Village - Mari Moxley

Pikes Peak Region

A collaborative documentary project in which young adults facing housing insecurity, currently residing in a tiny home village, direct point-of-view films that build community and transform how we witness one another's lives.

Our Words Are Powerful - Words To Power

Our Words Are Powerful brings together Words To Power and Cultivando to serve youth in the most polluted areas of Colorado as they find the power in their words through poetry workshops, an Earth Day community open mic event, four books of youth-written poetry, two book release events with youth performers, and social media videos of poems.

Youth Media Matters: Destigmatizing Mental Health and Sparking Courageous Conversations through Documentary Storytelling - Youth Documentary Academy

Youth Media Matters is a project of the Youth Documentary Academy (YDA) that engages high impact, high caliber, youth-produced films to destigmatize mental health topics and open the door to courageous, peer-to-peer conversations across Colorado.

Colorado Dashiki Festival - Colorado African Cultural Center

The Dashiki Festival is a dynamic three-day celebration of African arts and culture that fosters integration, identity, and belonging through music, dance, fashion, art/craft, and community engagement—using the power of the arts to bridge racial divides, empower youth, and promote mental well-being in Colorado.

TRANSformative Stories: Colorado Impact Tour - Motus Theater

Metro Denver Seven-County Region, Northern Colorado, Western Slope & Upper Arkansas Valley

With TRANSformative Stories: Impact Tour, Motus Theater launches a year-long impact tour across Colorado, using powerful autobiographical monologues to counter rising threats against transgender Coloradans and their families by engaging conservative-leaning communities that have fewer opportunities to access artful stories that uplift the humanity of transgender and nonbinary people, and key decision-makers through strategic, cross-sector collaborations with transgender & nonbinary advocacy leaders, community outreach organizations, and PRIDE organizations.

Focus on the Creek at Concrete Coyote - Concrete Couch

Pikes Peak Region

The "Focus on the Creek" project at Concrete Coyote Community Park in Colorado Springs will enhance Lower Shooks Run Creek's ecological health, improve safety along

the Legacy Loop Trail, and foster community pride through a mural, educational programs, a science and art kiosk, a youth summer camp, and volunteer opportunities.

Bloomers: Transforming Aging Through Arts, Culture, and Storytelling in Rural Colorado - The Blue Sage Center for the Arts

The Blue Sage Center for the Arts' Bloomers: Transforming Aging Through Arts, Culture, and Storytelling in Rural Colorado, is a year-long program featuring music and storytelling events that celebrate the lives of older adults.

Write to Connect - Lighthouse Writers Workshop, Inc.

Metro Denver Seven-County Region

Lighthouse Writers Workshop will host eight-week creative writing workshops for front-line staff at local social service organizations, offering a space for participants to engage with the literary arts to process their experiences—including highs and lows; triumphs and traumas—and build connections and camaraderie with others.

Building Colorado Artist Legacy: Creating Accessible Resources for Collection Planning for Artists and Their Families - Emily Grace King

Building Colorado Artist Legacy will create accessible resources for artists to decide what happens to their artworks after their deaths, empowering them to plan with their families to preserve their place in the cultural conversation and actively create their continuing legacy.

Procession - House of Kodō

Metro Denver Seven-County Region, Northern Colorado & Southeast Colorado

A Japanese-American woman confronts her past when she decides to attend her first pilgrimage to one of the 1940s incarceration camp sites on her 70th birthday.

Transcendent Femme: “Evolution of the Self in Community” - Kai Gaynor

Pikes Peak Region

Presented by Colorado Springs artist Kai Gaynor in October 2025, Transcendent Femme is a five-week immersive installation at the Meanwhile Block in Downtown Colorado Springs. The installation features a lush environment dominated by plants, textiles and paintings that create a welcoming atmosphere for challenging questions about what mental health means for Black Springs residents.

NestQuest: Harnessing the power of The Arts to personalize Salida’s housing crisis - KHEN Community Radio 106.9, Salida

Upper Arkansas Valley

NextQuest, a collaboration between artistic groups and local government agencies, examines the concept of “home” through multiple lenses (including storytelling,

performance, and visual arts) to help Chaffee County residents see that our current housing crisis impacts everyone in our community, regardless of home ownership or housing security status.

Fort Collins Mural Project - Everyone Deserves Art - Fort Collins Mural Project

Northern Colorado

In September, Fort Collins Mural Project, in partnership with the Alliance for Suicide Prevention of Larimer County, will launch an impactful mural tour with on-site support in Fort Collins, featuring new and existing murals by Colorado artists whose creativity address mental health and its interconnected social issues, all while cultivating empathy and providing vital and lasting resources to aid in the decrease in suicide rates and isolation within our community and its visitors.

The Knock: Opera Co-Production at the US Air Force Academy - The Chamber Orchestra of the Springs

A free performance of The Knock, an opera exploring the lives of military spouses on Colorado Springs' Fort Carson, as they learn about an incident overseas that has claimed the lives of one of their husbands, hosted at the US Air Force Academy.

Bringing Art & Culture into Pueblo's Public Transportation Stops

Pueblo Department of Public Health and Environment, in collaboration with Pueblo City's transit and public works departments, is beautifying bus stops near youth-friendly spaces with local artwork to create safe, welcoming environments, boost youth transit ridership, and strengthen community pride.
