BOUNDARY COTTAGE







Lecturer and creator of Bolton Percy churchyard garden, Roger Brook's own no-dig garden has

1500 plant varieties, many rare, providing colour all year round. The garden has numerous features, sweeping views, and holds the National Collection of Dicentra. Horticulturally unorthodox, especially the fruit and vegetables, the overall effect is dramatic.



ELLERKER HOUSE







Ellerker House was once the office belonging to Everingham Estate, owned by the Duke of Norfolk. The garden is 5 acres and comprises parkland, home to many mature trees including Corsican pines, Atlantic beech and many oaks, and a formal lawn surrounded by colourthemed herbaceous borders planted for texture and colour throughout the year. A rose archway planted with old English roses leads towards the lake which is surrounded by a woodland pathway made from tree roots and stumps and planted with many spring bulbs, hellebores and anemones to give a mass of colour, and extensive woodland to walk in.

OPEN: Sunday 2 September, 12–5pm **LOCATION:** Everingham YO42 4JA 51/2m from Pocklington. Just out of the village heading towards Harswell. PARKING: drive through the main gates and park along the drive



FOSSGYL







Alastair Fitter's long 1 acre garden stretches from Huntington Road to the River Foss. There are perennials, alpines, a peat-free 'peat' garden, a woodland garden, a traditional orchard with 85 year old trees mixed with more recently planted specimen trees and shrubs, a meadow with fritillaries in spring and orchids in summer, and wet woodland by the river with oxlips in spring and a large new pond. There are nearly 1000 species of plant in the garden, including 250 natives.

OPEN: Monday 7 May 11-5pm LOCATION: 533 Huntington Road, York YO32 9PY. 200m north of Huntington School PARKING: Blue badge holders down the (rather long, narrow) drive, or on local side streets (Burn Estate, Arbor Close)

FRIARS HILL



Win and James Baldwin's 134 acre garden is packed with spring interest, including hellebores, narcissi, fritillaries, trilliums, early paeonies, and other early gems.

OPEN: Sunday, 8 April, 1.30-4.30pm LOCATION: Sinnington YO62 6SL PARKING: on road or village green with short walk to Friars Hill



GARDEN OF EDEN





There's a long front garden at Stephen & Victoria Morley's home, with lawn edged with sinuous herbaceous borders and colourful, wildlife-friendly mixed plantings, including Digitalis, Eryngium, Agastache, and Rudbeckia, plus a sprinkling of larger exotics. The rear family garden has vegetable beds, chickens and herbaceous and shrub borders with a slight tropical feel. The greenhouse holds an exceptional collection of carnivorous and subtropical plants, which make this garden very special indeed.

THE HAYLOFT








Sir John Lawton welcomes you to explore his formal front garden, more informal back garden and orchard. There's a good variety of interesting plants in beds ranging from hot and dry to cool and damp, plus a small open meadow and a larger orchard meadow.

OPEN: Sunday 5 August 10.30am-5pm **LOCATION:** Holburns Croft, Heslington, York YO10 5DP. From Heslington Hall head west towards Fulford. Holburns Croft is second on the left after Main Street PARKING: On the house drive or, if full, on road

JACKSON'S WOLD GARDEN (A) ★ ¥ **(D)**



OPEN: Sunday 20 May and Sunday 17th June 1-5pm LOCATION: Jacksons Wold YO17 8QJ. Take the Weaverthorpe Road at the A64 traffic lights in Sherburn. After 100 yards take the right hand fork signposted Heslerton Wold. After a mile there is a farm road on the left. Follow the signs for Jackson's Wold Garden. PARKING: On the grass outside the garden





NESS HALL



Ness Hall garden has been gardened by 3 generations of Murray Wells, situated near the river Rye with views to the north York moors. The main garden is in the 17th Century walled garden. This is divided up into 'rooms' varying from a woodland area, kitchen garden, water garden, cutting garden and 'fairy' garden. Often described as a large cottage garden, Ness has a certain magic about it. We also have a 3 acre orchard which visitors can wander around. In early July, the garden should be at its peak, with an abundance of roses, digitalis and campanulas.

OPEN: Sunday 1 July, 12-4pm LOCATION: East Ness YO62 5XD PARKING: as signed, in front of the house in the parkland



THE OLD SMITHY



Chris and Sheila Bridge's garden has colour for twelve months of the year. Last year we opened in July and September, with herbaceous highlights. Opening in June will show another facet of the garden. The Old Smithy is an intimate garden, of about half an acre, sloping down to a chalk stream and views of the Wolds. Designed by poet and novelist Chris, the garden has seasonal areas, vegetables, lawns, a compost site and a goldfish pond.

OPEN: Sunday 3 Jun 1-5pm. LOCATION: Main Street, Wintringham, YO17 8HX, on the right hand (south) side just past the (small) war memorial. PARKING: on the road

PADDOCK COTTAGE







Helen and Colin Crews have a small cottage garden with views across countryside and attractive mixed borders and a wide range of plants in both sunny and shaded areas. In particular in late spring and early summer there are hellebores, Meconopsis and Iris. There are also raised vegetable plots, a small glasshouse and a fishpond.

OPEN: Sunday 3 June 10am-4pm. LOCATION:: 4 Sudnicton Croft, Westow, YO60 7NB. In Westow take the road (Main Street) signposted Burythorpe & Church. Before reaching a turning to the Church only, turn left down a gravel track signposted Sudnicton Croft on wall. PARKING: limited parking near house, otherwise on nearby streets

THE POPLARS







The Poplars (Peter and Christina Young) has unusual tender plants in a densely planted garden and conservatory around a Victorian house and barns, and a compact arboretum with over a hundred species of trees and shrubs. Also fruit and vegetable gardens, llama paddocks, wildlife pond.

OPEN: Sunday 5 August, 2-6pm. LOCATION:: The Poplars, Main Street, Newton upon Derwent, York YO41 4DA, in the centre of the village. PARKING: at rear of The Poplars or on Main Street

WEATHERVANE HOUSE







Peter & Julie Williams' large woodland garden with acid loving plants including rhododendrons, azaleas, magnolias and other interesting shrubs. Spring bulbs including trilliums, flowering trees and shade tolerant herbaceous perennials. Well-stocked glasshouse and large polytunnel with wide range of plants propagated from seeds, cuttings and grafting. Meadow area and woodland home to owls, goldcrests and sparrow hawks.

OPEN: Sunday 6 and Monday 7 May 12-5pm. Other times in May and early June possible for small groups of 4-8 people by arrangement (peteandjuliew@gmail. com) LOCATION: Mill Lane, Seaton Ross, York, YO42 4NE.
