


# The Holy Land

**Day 1: DEPARTURE from North America.** This morning we meet at the airport for our trans-Atlantic flight to Israel.

**Day 2: ISRAEL - TEL AVIV - BEERSHEBA.** Upon our arrival we meet our guide and board our bus. We begin our tour of the Holy Land by first driving south through the Philistine cities on our way to Beersheba. We stop in the Valley of Elah for a view where David encountered Goliath. Then arriving in Beersheba, we visit Abraham's Well. The rest of the day is at leisure at our hotel for relaxation before dinner.

**Day 3: WILDERNESS OF ZIN - TIMNA - EILAT - PETRA.** This morning we drive to view the stupendous wilderness of Zin. We continue south through the Negev, the desert region of southern Israel to visit the Tabernacle in the Wilderness, a life-size replica of the biblical tabernacle located in Timna Valley. Continue to Eilat, a busy port and resort city. Stop for lunch (on our own) and see the Red Sea. Then we arrive at the Arava Border and cross into Jordan. Continue to Petra for dinner and overnight.



**Day 4: PETRA – SHOBAK - AMMAN.** This morning after breakfast, we visit Petra. This ancient Edomite and Nabatean capital is an amazing city of prophecy. See this spectacular "City of the Dead" with its famed gorge, ancient street, temples, dwelling places and tombs carved from the solid rock. Arrive at El Ji Post and continue the one-mile journey on horseback, or walk, passing through the famous SIQ (natural gorge) and arrive at the "Treasury". Visit the ancient theater. In the Nabatean Judgment Hall, Place Tombs, famous Urn Temple and the Roman amphitheater. Those willing to climb may view the monastery, Jebel Harun (Mountain of Aaron), supposed to be the burial place of Aaron. Horseback journey back to El Ji Post. This afternoon

we drive along the Exodus route north along the famed historical King's Highway passing by the conserved Crusader castle of Shobak. From there we go to the Dead Sea in Jordan for some leisure time before dinner and overnight.

**Day 5: MT. NEBO - BAPTISMAL SITE - JERICHO - JORDAN VALLEY - SEA OF GALILEE.** This morning we take a short drive to Mt. Nebo, from which God showed Moses the Promised Land. Continue to the recently discovered baptismal site of "Bethany beyond the Jordan." For Christians, the most significant event associated with the River Jordan is undoubtedly the baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ by John the Baptist. We then proceed to the Allenby Bridge to return back to Israel. We again rejoin our bus and guide from the Holy Land. We drive to Jericho and view the traditional mountain of Jesus' temptation. Driving through the Jordan Valley we enter Harod's Valley. Jesus healed the 10 lepers here somewhere in this valley. We continue on the Ein Harod where Gideon thinned out his army as he brought them to the spring and sorted them on the basis of how they drank from the water. We drive through the Jezreel Valley back towards Beth Shean to view the setting for the death of Saul, surveying the magnificent Roman and Byzantine ruins: theatre, bathhouses, ancient rest rooms, market areas, colonnaded streets. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Tiberias.

**Day 6: SEA OF GALILEE.** This morning we take a double-time replica boat ride on the Sea of Galilee to Capernaum including the throwing of the net. We visit the synagogue and spend some time at the place where early Christians remembered Peter's house. We continue to Tabgha to view the mosaics in the Church of the Loaves and Fishes (Multiplication) and the Church of the Primacy where Jesus shared breakfast. Stop at Sower's Cove near Tagbha and see the natural amphitheater. Here it is believed Jesus taught the Parable of the Sower (Mark 4:1-9) from a boat moored in the bay. Then we ascend to the Mount of Beatitudes. Then we rest with a St. Peter's Fish luncheon (included). We continue along the east side of the sea and stop at the plains of Bethsaida. Continue to the ruins of Magdala where Mary Magdalen lived. Then to the Baptism site on the Jordan River at Yardenit for a service. Dinner and overnight.

**Day 7: NAZARETH - MT. CARMEL - ABRAHAM'S TENT - JERUSALEM.** This morning we depart Tiberias and view Mt. Tabor on the way to Nazareth. Stop for a view of Mount Precipice for a photo op. Visit the Church of Annunciation

with the cave underneath and the Synagogue Church. Our day continues as we ascend Mt. Carmel, site of Elijah's confrontation with the prophets of Baal with a beautiful view of the valley. After descending the mountain, we drive toward the south to Abraham's Tent to re-live the old customs. Enjoy the activities here before an early dinner at the tent. Continue on to the Holy City of Jerusalem for overnight. On the way stop at Mt. of Olives for a view of the city at night.

**Day 8: JERUSALEM - MT OF OLIVES - GETHSEMANE - BETHLEHEM.** We begin our day at Mt. Scopus and the Mt. of Olives (*Matthew 24:3*) with a panoramic view of the Old City of Jerusalem. Here, we visit the Chapel of the Ascension, the Church of Pater Noster and the Dominus Flevit. We walk along Hosanna Road to the Gethsemane to visit the Church of All Nations which stands on the Rock of Agony where Jesus was betrayed by Judas (*Matthew 26:36-57*). See the Pillar of Absalom, the Eastern (Golden) Gate and the Pinnacle of the Temple. We then drive to Mt. Zion where we visit the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu on the site of Caiaphas' House, the Room of the Last Supper (*Luke 22:14-20*) and the Tomb of King David. Traveling south, we drive by Solomon's Pools, Jerusalem's main source of water for almost 2000 years. Passing the monastery of Hortus Conclusus in Artas, we go to Shepherd's Fields. Then continue with a visit to Bethlehem, walking through its alleys and markets to the Church of the Nativity. Return to Jerusalem and visit Bethany, the home of Mary, Martha and Lazarus (*John 11:1-46*). Bethany was where Lazarus was raised from the dead. See Lazarus' Tomb. Then to our hotel for dinner and overnight.



**Day 9: JERUSALEM - THE OLD CITY.** Just inside the Dung Gate, we examine the ruins near the south side of the Temple complex, including steps where Jesus and the disciples walked. We walk up to the Western Wall, Judaism's holiest site. We walk around near the El Aksa Mosque and the Dome

of the Rock that was built on the ancient site of Solomon's Temple (*Genesis 22:9-14*) and over the Rock of Sacrifice where Abraham offered Isaac (*Genesis 22*) and the ceremonial sacrifice of animals took place. Just to the north we find the Pools of Bethesda and St. Anne's Church preserved from the Crusader period. We walk through the Christian Quarter along the Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulchre. Our day concludes at the Garden Tomb for a special visit and private service. Dinner and overnight.



**Day 10: NEW JERUSALEM - JOPPA - Airport.** This morning we visit New Jerusalem: the Israel Museum, the Shrine of the Book that houses the Dead Sea Scrolls and the Model City of Jerusalem which depicts in miniature the Holy City as it appeared in the first century. After lunch continue to Emmaus where Jesus appeared after Resurrection (*Luke 24:30-31*). Our afternoon drive will take us to Ancient Joppa on the Sea where Jonah set sail and where Peter raised Dorcas from the dead. Joppa was also the home of Simon the Tanner. Then to a local restaurant for a Farewell Dinner. We continue to the airport for our late evening flight to the U.S.

**Day 11: TEL AVIV - USA.** Early morning arrival in the U.S. and continue home - the end of a most enjoyable journey.
