

White-tailed deer (Odocoileus virginianus)



<u>Description</u>: White fur on belly, around eyes and nose, and spots on hind legs, along with distinguishing white bottom of tail. Red, brown or grey coat. Male deer have antlers.

<u>Diet: Twigs leaves grasses grains mushroom.</u>

<u>Diet</u>: Twigs, leaves, grasses, grains, mushroom, fruit, bark.

Winter Wildlife



Moose (Alces alces)



<u>Description</u>: Largest member of the deer family. Dark brown with long legs, large nose, shoulder hump and beard. Males have large antlers. Weigh between 200-800 kg.

<u>Diet</u>: Twigs, broadleaf plants and bark of shrubs and trees, as well as aquatic vegetation.




Coyote (Canis latrans)



<u>Description</u>: Smaller than wolf, with thin legs and pointy, fox-like nose. Grey colouring helps blend into surroundings. Average weight 13kg, with males slightly heavier than females.

<u>Diet</u>: Hare, squirrels, beaver, voles, mice, birds, insects, berries, fruits, and unprotected young of larger mammals.



Description: White or white flecked with black. Average height is 60 cm.

<u>Diet</u>: Hare, mice, and other small mammals and birds. <u>Track</u>: Wing print from landing in snow to attack prey.



Vole (Microtis spp.)

<u>Description</u>: Round head with small ears and eyes. Stout body with a short hairy tail.

Diet: Seeds and grains.

<u>Track</u>: Less than one inch long in paired hopping pattern. Tail will occasionally leave a mark.



Snowshoe hare (Lepus americanus)

Description: Very large hind feet. Brown fur in summer; white fur in winter. Average weight is 1.5 kg.

<u>Diet</u>: Juicy plants in summer, trees and woody shrubs in winter.

<u>Track:</u> Oval shaped prints in 'Y' shaped stride. Front feet: 2-3 inches long and 1-2.25 inches wide. Back feet: 3.25-6 inches long and 1.5-5 inches wide.
