Support/oppose Syria mission–ISIS in survival mode

ISIS no longer controls any territory in Iraq or Syria. The group's "territorial caliphate" reached its greatest extent in May 2015 and was destroyed by the global coalition to defeat ISIS and ceased to exist by March 2019. As of November 2023, the Department of Defense Inspector General's Quarterly Report concluded that ISIS is, "in survival mode in Iraq and Syria," and that the group's capabilities "continued to decline, and became less sophisticated and complex."
