

Okanogan & Columbia Rivers - Summer/Fall Chinook Fishery

2017 CCT Tribal Member Fishing Regulations

Justification

This selective fishery targets hatchery origin (adipose fin clipped) ESA-unlisted Upper Columbia River (UCR) summer/fall Chinook salmon. The UCR summer Chinook pre-season run projection to the Columbia River mouth is approximately 63,100 fish. The harvest agreement between the Colville Tribes and the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife provides a CCT harvest allocation of approximately 4,300 summer Chinook.

This fishery is regulated to comply with CCT's yearly allocation of summer Chinook and to avoid significant take of ESA-listed threatened Upper Columbia River (UCR) steelhead needed for spawning escapement and broodstock. To protect ESA-listed UCR steelhead, this fishery may be closed or otherwise amended by the Colville Tribes Director of Fish and Wildlife (Director)

Fishery Location/Period/Gear

Location: Okanogan River

Okanogan River from the Hwy 97 Bridge in the Columbia River confluence area near Brewster, WA, to the international border with Canada near Oroville, WA, *except fishing is prohibited from 400 feet below Zosel Dam to the log boom 200 feet upstream of Zosel Dam.*

Period:

July 1, 2017 through *August 31, 2017*, unless closed by the Director.

Authorized Gear:

Tangle nets, hook and line (bait allowed), hand dip nets and hoop nets.

- Tangle nets: mesh size- 3" – 4½" stretched, length not to exceed one-half (1/2) the wetted river width, or 100 feet, whichever is less

Location: Columbia River

Mainstem Columbia River from the Hwy 17 Bridge in Bridgeport, WA, to the Hwy 97 Bridge upstream of the Okanogan River confluence area.

Period:

July 1, 2017 through *September 30, 2017*, unless closed by the Director. The fishery may be extended into October, at the discretion of the Director, depending on the level of incidental take of ESA listed summer steelhead.

Authorized Gear:

Tangle nets, hook and line (bait allowed), hand dip nets and hoop nets.

- Tangle nets: mesh size- 3" – 4½" stretched, length not to exceed one-half (1/2) the wetted river width, or 100 feet, whichever is less.

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Special Regulations/Restrictions:

- Release all wild Chinook (adipose fin present)
- Release all bull trout
- Release all sturgeon
- Release all wild steelhead (adipose fin present)
- Release all hatchery steelhead (adipose fin absent with healed scar), unless concurrent with an authorized hatchery steelhead fishery, except release floy-tagged, radio-tagged and tail-punched steelhead
- Hatchery Chinook (adipose fin absent) retention allowed, except release of floy-tagged, radio-tagged and tail-punched Chinook
- Sockeye retention allowed, except release of floy-tagged, radio-tagged and tail-punched Sockeye
- Snagging prohibited
- Gillnets prohibited
- Gaffs and spears prohibited
- All tangle nets must be registered at the Nespelem Fish and Wildlife Office
- All tangle nets must display net registration tag (tag provided during net registration)
- Tangle nets must be checked for fish every twenty minutes and may not be left unattended
- Tangle nets that are fished between official sunset and official sunrise must have lighted buoys on both ends of the net unless the net is attached to a boat. If the net is attached to a boat, then one lighted buoy on the opposite end of the net from the boat is required
- Hook and line fishing from Scaffolds allowed (bait allowed), except scaffolds priority to hoop and dip net fishing
- Parking at Colville Tribal Fish Hatchery fishery area in designated areas only
- Alcohol and illegal drugs (including marijuana products) prohibited at the Colville Tribal Fish Hatchery fishery area
- Quiet hours at the Colville Tribal Fish Hatchery fishery area 10 pm–8 am
- Cleaning of fish at the Colville Tribal Fish Hatchery fishery area prohibited

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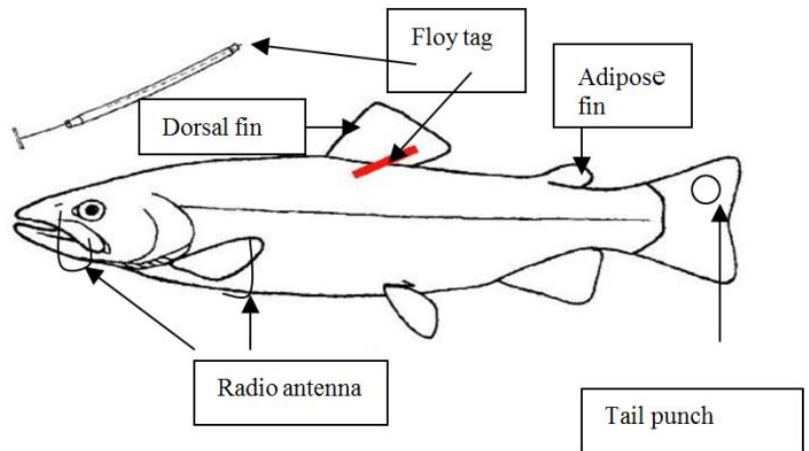
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Harvest Reporting:

- All fishers will record the number of fish encountered on a salmon catch card. Information will include date of fishing effort, number of adult Chinook harvested, number of jack Chinook harvested (less than 26 inches); number of wild Chinook released; number of sockeye harvested; number of steelhead released, number of hatchery steelhead (adipose fin absent) harvested and number of bull trout released.
- Harvest information must be provided to Tribal creel clerks and other authorized Tribal Fish & Wildlife personnel upon request.
- All salmon that are harvested must be recorded on a salmon catch card and submitted to Fish & Wildlife on a weekly basis. All catch cards are to be returned to Fish & Wildlife no later than October 31, 2017.

MS-222 Warning:

Floy-tagged, radio-tagged and tail-punched fish that are caught in this fishery should be released and not eaten. It is unsafe to eat these fish because they are anesthetized with MS-222 (a known carcinogen to humans) in order to implant the tags or otherwise conduct stock assessment research. They are identified with a colored, external floy tag located near the dorsal fin, radio antenna protruding from the mouth or body and/or a small hole ($\frac{1}{4}$ " diameter) in the upper lobe of the tail.

Information from this form will help the Department determine harvest rates, stock identification, and will provide a means for the Tribal creel census taker to contact you. Net fisheries are opened by in season regulation on a yearly basis and are subject to Emergency Closure. Remember to read the regulations for information pertaining to net fisheries. All net fishers are required to report catch/release data. You can register for both sockeye and Chinook fisheries by circling the two species below by "Fishing for".
