Learning Outcomes:

Content Area and Topic:

The curriculum contains a collection of nxa?amxčín stories provided and translated by the Colville Language Program. These stories have been passed on teaching about the local environment and its wildlife. Worksheets have been designed for students to think critically about each story and personalize each to oneself.

Objectives:

Objective1: Be able to recognize and use at least 4 vocab. words per story

Objective 2: Knowledge of 2 foods and resources pertaining to the local environment

Objective 3: Be able to recite at least 1 story

Objective 4: Develop 1 personal connection to each story using the worksheets.

Preparation:

Approx. 10-15 min- Teachers please read through the stories beforehand to have an understanding of the stories to make them more relatable to your students. Vocabulary and audio books will be included for pronunciation of language words.
