antasies is about connection and dissolving, curiosity for new sensations, and the strangeness of being in a body. Salvaged everyday textile items of bygone eras are transformed to accentuate their imbued cultural significance as objects of material culture.

Materials from the 1960s and 1970s, such as fabrics, lace trims, bed linen, milliner's straw, grosgrain ribbons, hoolahoops, garter belt clips, undergarments and nighties, are repurposed to playfully celebrate conscious and unconscious desires, erotic longings, excitements and curiosities connected to intimacy and aloneness. Engaging with ideas around feminism, material culture, sexuality and eroticism, the works are metaphorical and suggestive, playful and quiet. Through their sheer tulle and lace components, the sculptures resonate against and through one another. In 2017, individual pieces from this series have been shown at Perth Institute of Contemporary Art (Western Australia), Yarra Sculpture Gallery (Victoria) and Craft (Victoria).






Dissolved nightie in lilac 66cm x 220cm x 6cm
