TREASURER'S REPORT NOVEMBER 2015

Happy New Year to all! May this new year be filled with good health and happiness for all of our Hollybrook family.

During the past year our CEO, Paul Ray and CFO, Joseph Donnelly, have been preparing for the major transition of moving our fiscal year start from January I to April I which has been accomplished quite easily and without any noticeable impact to any of us. Additionally, we also have on another major started transition in the manner in which we structure our budget. Our Board of Directors, after an extensive workshop on the subject, has directed that we proceed with a reserve structure which advocates utilizing what is referred to as "less than adequate, 70 percent funded reserves". And so, when the budget for the new fiscal year is presented to you, you will see the precise structure itemized which accomplishes providing specific pooled reserves for the items listed in the budget.

Let's explain, once again, what these terms mean. Until this year, Hollybrook has operated on a cash flow system. We allocated funds for roofs, paving, painting, etc., but the money was maintained for separate allocations. However, if we need to borrow or use the funds from those accounts, we can and may do so in order to satisfy our fiscal needs. This procedure has served us well for the past 38+ years. So, if it's not broken, why are we making this change? The answer is complex but logical.

First and foremost, Hollybrook has always looked forward and planned for the future. Changing to this new concept of reserve structure demonstrates our continuing efforts to plan for the future fiscal and structural well being of Hollybrook. Let us all be aware of the fact that we are forty years old and we must recognize and prepare for the needs of our aging community. infrastructure, which currently is still in pretty good shape, now needs to be scrutinized and kept sound. We must do our best to take active roles in safeguarding and improving these common elements.

Last year the Board of Directors requested that a reserve study be conducted to quantify the current and future costs of our common elements. The reserve study was conducted and the report established necessary criteria to be developed in order to set up a funding schedule to achieve the "less than adequate 70 percent funded reserves".

By setting up these specific pooled allocations to meet

the expected needs of our common elements, as outlined in our reserve study, we will be prepared to handle the anticipated funding needs our infrastructure will be facing and, hopefully, minimizing the need for special assessments to handle these situations. Of course, the reserve study and/ or the new system of reserves cannot and will not eliminate any emergency or extraordinary events that may occur in the future, such as catastrophic storm damage or the like, but it will put us in a fiscally sound condition to address our essential needs. Implementing this system of reserve structure was recently endorsed our accountant, Daniel Arty, CPA, of Arty, Cohen. CPAs, and he praised our efforts to accomplish this changeover as being a positive step in the right direction and in the best interests of our Hollybrook community.

I hope this helps explain our rationale for making this transition to "less than adequate 70 percent funded reserves. If you have any questions

or concerns, please feel free to contact me and I will try to address concerns with logical answers.






Bridge Player's Survival Kit

How do we get to slam? Part 1

A student recently sent some deals to review. She was a statistics major in college and relishes the complexities of slam bidding. The following was the first problem deal.

How does North show her strength? A 3 rebid shows medium values, and North has a maximum hand, but what rebid shows that? Also, how do we find our heart fit?

West led the ♦ 3. North–South scored plus 660 for making 11 tricks.

North's rebid shows a good six-card suit but only a medium-strength hand (16–18 points). Counting two distribution points for the club length, this hand is worth around 19 points. If an eight-card heart fit exists, North's hand is actually more powerful than the point-count indicates!

You can learn many bidding tools to help describe (or discover) the distribution and strength of the partnership's assets. What is tough to learn (and teach) is possibly the single most important aid in finding slams: attitude!

Studmuffin often recalls a game of Scrabble he played against his mother in which he scored two seven-letter words! For non-Scrabble players, that's like having two grand slams in one session. His mother opined that she never seemed to get a seven-letter score. Studmuffin suggested that it might be because she never looked for those rare but exciting plays.

At the bridge table, it sometimes is just as important to make a leap of faith as a leap in the bidding.

On this deal, North and South had tough hands to describe. Both settled for bids that were reasonable but not daring.

North had a lot of things to communicate on her rebid: a maximum hand, good six-card club suit, good three-card heart support and controls in all four suits! All of her rebid options were flawed: 2NT would promise a balanced hand; any strong heart raise (e.g., a jump to 4♥ or a 4♠ splinter bid) would promise four-card support; a game-forcing jump shift to 2♠ would promise a four-card spade suit and would risk South "correcting" any later heart raise back to spades; and, of course, the 3♣ rebid doesn't show the hand's power.

North might have bid 4NT (Blackwood) over the 1♥ response - the cowboy approach - but that could be wrong if South had responded 1♥ with four low cards in the suit. Using Roman Key Card Blackwood, at least North would have been able to find out about the trump king. Here is a reasonable auction to get to slam with the North– South hands.

West	North	East	South

- Assuming North doesn't have a sixshooter and a 10-gallon hat, she has to choose among the flawed rebids.
- (2) Even though North's jump rebid was only game-invitational, in standard bidding, any call by South at this point (except pass) would be game-forcing. If North had rebid 2NT (18–19 with a different hand), the situation would be similar. By agreement, South's 3 ♥ rebid in a (now) forcing auction could be with only a five-card suit. Perfect!
- (3) Reassured about the eight-card heart fit, North checks for aces and gets to slam.

South wins the diamond lead and leads a low heart to dummy's jack at trick two, losing to East's queen. Declarer ruffs the diamond return with dummy's 5, cashes dummy's ♥ A and leads a low spade to her ace to finish drawing trumps. Dummy's club suit allows her to later pitch her other diamond loser. Result: Making six, plus 1430 for North-South.







Below are a few that will continue to have my full attention.

- 75% Recycling Goal. Broward County needs to limit landfilling and increase recycling across the board. I will continue to work with my colleagues on the County Commission, as well as the Mayors and Commissioners across the 31 different Cities throughout the County, to encourage recycling at all of our multi-family and commercial facilities. This is a goal we can achieve.
- Vegetated Sand Dunes. Sea level rise is real and the projections require action. Broward County needs to plant a complete line of vegetated sand dunes from Hallandale Beach to Deerfield Beach in order to protect the sand on our beaches.
- Electric Vehicle Charging Stations. It's time for Broward County to build a comprehensive network of electric vehicle charging stations. If we had just one electric vehicle charging station for every 10 gas stations in our County, we could make it that

much easier for commuters to switch to electric vehicles.

• Increased Standards for Child Care. Broward County needs to invest in Early Childhood Education. We know that the best practices in Early Childhood Education can be implemented at all of our Child Care Facilities in Broward County, but we need to raise the standards. Every child care worker in our community should, at a minimum, have a Child Development Associates Degree. By raising these standards we will help young children develop the skills necessary to enter school ready to learn.

Volunteer Opportunity – Help Broward County Conduct the Homeless Point-in-Time Count.

You may remember from my column in last month's issue, that we need volunteers for the Homeless Point-in-Time Count. The Point-in-Time Count is the best tool for tracking where the needs are greatest in our community, and where our programs have been most successful. From Tuesday, January 26th through Thursday, January 28th teams of two, three, or four volunteers

will canvass the known sites where individuals experiencing homelessness gather.

If you would like to volunteer for the Homeless Point-in-Time Count, please visit http://pit.brhpc.org/ to register as a volunteer. If you and several friends want to register as a team, you can do so. If you do not have a team, you will be assigned to one on the day of the Point-in-Time Count. The goal is to sign up 200 volunteers by the beginning of volunteer training, which runs from January 12th through the 14th. you can gather a group of 10 or more volunteers, you can email a request to PITvolunteers@brhpc.org for the Broward Regional Health Planning Council to arrange for a trainer to come to you.

A \$2.00 purchase at a Coney Island flea market 30 years ago for 200 assorted buttons depicting the faces of presidential candidates, slogans and awards has turned Allen Sklar into a collector.

He now has a wall in his condo covered with 6000 buttons, including University buttons, love buttons, sports buttons, and one with the picture of Shirley Chisholm, the first black woman elected to Congress, and political buttons

that date back to 1840. The list of various buttons is endless.

If that isn't enough, he also has a collection of 1700 patches from fire stations in all 50 U.S. states and 14 countries including Peru and Australia which are framed and hung at the Pembroke Pines Fire Rescue Headquarters where he was a volunteer until 5 months ago, at which time he "retired".



New Year's Day, 2000 B C, Babylonia

Our word, holiday, comes from The Middle English, 'halidai', meaning 'holy day', for until recently, humankind's celebrations were of a religious nature. New Year's Day is the oldest and most universal of all such 'holy days'. Oddly enough, the 'year' was the time between the sowing of the seeds and the harvesting of the crops. The earliest recorded New Year's festival was in the city of Babylonia, whose

ruins stand near the modern town of al Hillah, Iraq. It was celebrated in late March, at the Vernal equinox, when spring begins, and lasted 11 days. After the high Priest led all the religious offerings and washings, the hymn to the region's God of agriculture was sang praying for the next year's harvest. The rump of a beheaded ram was then rubbed against the temple walls to absorb any contagion that might infest the sacred edifice, and, by implication,

the harvest. The ceremony was called 'kuppuru', a word that appeared among the Hebrews at about the same time, in their Day of Atonement festival, Yom Kippur. How New Year's Day moved from March, springtime, to the dead of winter, is too long a tale to repeat here. Suffice it to say, to reset the calendar in 46 B C, Julius Caesar had to let the year drag on for 445 days, earning it the historical sobriquet, 'Year of Confusion.'





DO YOU BELIEVE IN WITCHES?

Do you believe in Witches? Perhaps after you read this, you will. 11th, 1979 saw a firebombing by three men, Hiram Perez, 16; his father, Matias, 53; and his brother-in-law, Luis Garcia, 25. Miss Marin and her 11 year old daughter testified as eye witnesses to the fire-bombing. They said they saw Garcia light the wick to a gasoline filled wine bottle and that Hiram threw it through the window. Hiram's attorney attacked the credibility of Miss Marin and her daughter, pointing out that she, "(Miss Marin) over-reacted in her denial of ever hearing about witchcraft. "She thinks she saw Hiram..she struck out at someone in her despair, grief and anger after seeing her mother die in the fire." Obviously, the defense attorney did a great job of confusing the witnesses and the jurors. The three men were released. Here's the 'funny' part of the story: Within the next six months, Hiram hanged himself; Matias was murdered; and Luis Garcia was crushed to death in the teeth of a garbage truck. Hmmm, witches? I wonder!


