

Status of Documents Update Initiative

Claude A Lachance, Director (Towers), co-chair, Documents Update Steering Committee.

Hollybrook Golf and Tennis Condominium is governed by four instruments: the Declaration of Condominium, the Statutes of Incorporation, By-laws, and Rules and Regulations. These four instruments are commonly referred to as the « Hollybrook Documents ». Except for the Rules and Regulations which were compiled and revised in 2012, the other three Documents, as amended from time to time, need updating to reflect changes in the law, and address inconsistencies in the governance of our condominium. For that purpose, a joint proposal by the Legal Committee and the Strategic Planning Committee was adopted by the Board of Administration

earlier this year asking Legal Counsel to draft updated Hollybrook Documents reflect changes in the law, correct inconsistencies, andstrengthen the governance of the condominium. It is expected that the updated Hollybrook Documents » will be ready for a vote by the membership this Fall. There will be ample opportunity for unit owners to get themselves informed on the proposed governance structure of the condominium prior to casting their vote on the updated documents. Because the "Hollybrook Documents" define who and what we are as a community, everyone should be ready to engage in this process, get information, and vote. Our condominium is closing on 50 years, and our Documents show their age as well.

This initiative is critically important for assuring the future of our community, and all of us who care about Hollybrook need to be involved.

- A. Birds & animals are not allowed in the recreation area at the pools.
- B. All barbecue grills areas are available from noon until 9:00pm on Sat, Sun & holidays Phases 1-6 barbecues are available noon to 9pm Monday-Friday. Towers barbecue grills are available 5pm until 9pm Monday-Friday Owner/Lessee using the barbecue facilities must leave same in clean and sanitary condition. Effective November 15, 2014. Effective 2016
- C. Persons must reserve the barbecue and dining area, which will give them exclusive rights to the (Continued on page 9)

The Director of Communications will confirmation assign numbers to each reservation. the Pool Captain. The Pool Captain the authority has allocate the grills when multiple residents request the same time. On holidays, a lottery will be held by the pool captain when multiple requests have been made. The BBQ grill can be reserved up to 90 days ahead of the required date. Reservations by the same residents cannot be made until 48 hours after the most recent date reserved.

In the absence of the Director of Communication, reservations must made through a Director of that Phase. Pool Captain. The resident need not be a resident of that Phase. If additional tables and chairs or a coffee pot are needed, the Owner/Lessee must notify Maintenance Director of Communication at least 5 days before (on a first come basis. A reservation list shall be posted at the pool notifying all residents of the reserved dates and online.

E. The courts and equipment use for the shuffleboard courts, the horseshoes (phase 6) and the bocce courts (phase 6) shall be on a "first come - first serve" basis. Children playing accompanied must by an adult. All players must properly store the shuffleboard equipment after using it. Play hours are from 9:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M. only.

DOG AND DOG OWNER ETIQUETTE

series of articles that can help you and your dog become welcome anv environment. Pet owners have a responsibility to manage their pets. Gentle training doesn't mean allowing bad manners. Appropriate behavior paves the way for pleasant relations and peaceful coexistence among dog owners and non-owners alike. This article series should help answer many questions of what your dog is thinking and

how to react to a particular situation. Dogs have their own language which they quickly learn from their doggy mom. It's spoken from the end of their tail to the tips of their ears and develops further with each new experience they have.

Teach appropriate dog-to-dog introductions.

It is NOT appropriate for dogs to "play" with other dogs while on leash. Dogs must learn that there is play time, and a time to pay attention to you. A well-behaved dog, focused on its owner, can walk-by another dog and greet it appropriately, sniffing five seconds. Allowing your dog to jump all over another dog can result in injury to one or both.

Some dogs are submissive; others are not. Attempting to assert dominance, a dog may

stand high on its front feet and draw up to appear larger. If this doesn't work, one dog can try to place its paw over the back of the other dog or resting its head along the other dog's back. There is also what's called the "T-position", where the dog who wants to be dominant will stand with both feet on the other dog's back. The dog trying to be dominant can also stand sideways in front of the other dog, blocking its path.

And, of course, there is mounting, where the dominant dog will mount the submissive dog and hang on with its forepaws. If there are other dogs around, this clearly tells them that the dog who is mounting the other is superior to all the other dogs who may be around.

Many submissive dogs will allow this type of behavior – up to a point. And without warning, will bite. This gesture may simply function as a theatrical display and nothing further occurs. If, however, the biting becomes serious, keeping an umbrella or a walking stick to insert between the two dogs can help. Under NO circumstance, put your hands in between two biting dogs. They can, and usually do, transfer their aggression to whatever is there - in this case, you.

CHEESECAKE STUFFED STRAWBERRIES

Ingredients:

1 lb. fresh strawberries, rinsed and pat dry
8 oz. cream cheese, softened
1/2 cup powdered sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
Graham cracker crumbs, optional

Directions:

With a paring knife, cut off the strawberry stems. Cut around

the inside of the strawberry, hollowing out slightly and a well for creating the cheesecake. (You can also do this with a small melon baller). Cut off a small portion of the pointy strawberry tip, so that each strawberry can stand. Place each on a large baking sheet. In a medium bowl, with a standing or handheld electric mixer, beat cream cheese, sugar, and vanilla until fluffy, about 2 minutes on medium speed. Place mixture in a pastry bag and pipe into each strawberry, adding a little extra to the top. Refrigerate until thoroughly chilled. Optionally, sprinkle graham cracker crumbs on top of each stuffed strawberry.

Try this variation for patriotic holidays:

Use large strawberries and after stuffing them insert a blueberry. Red, white and blue!

Ingredients:


4 pints softened vanilla ice cream

The Real Deal BY LARRY COHEN www.larryco.com The better 3-0

This deal was played in the 2014 Denver Regional knockout. All vulnerable, South picked up:

★K2 ♥A98765 ◆8 **♣**AKJ

He opened 1♥ and partner responded 4♣ a splinter bid. South has wasted club cards, but still quite a good hand. Should South explore for slam?

A good idea is to picture a few possible hands for partner. Opposite a hand such as:

♠Q765 ♥KJ42 ♦AJ76 **♣**3

 \triangle A876 \forall KQ42 \Diamond Q762 \triangle 3,

slam is great. Even opposite an unsuitable hand such as:

♠Q765 **♥**KQ42 **♦**KQ32 **♣**2,

you'd still be OK on the five level. So I would try for slam, and Roman Key Card Blackwood seems the best tool. No need to make a control bid. If partner has two key cards (either two aces or one ace and the ♥K), you can bid the slam. Partner shows the required two key cards and you bid 6♥.

- ♠ A 8 7 5 3
- **♥** K J 10 3
- ♦9765
- **.**
- **♠** K 2
- ♥A98765
- **♦**8
- **♣** A K J 5

How should you play after the ♣ 10 lead?

If trumps are 2-1, you will be able to draw trumps and claim, probably making an overtrick by setting up the spades to discard your singleton diamond.

But what if trumps are 3-0? If you knew who had three and who had zero, you would start with the ace or king

accordingly. Without knowing, how should you start trumps?

There is a subtle reason to start with the \P A If everyone follows, it won't matter either way. If RHO shows out on the \P A, you will have a marked finesse for West's queen.

But even if LHO shows out, you still have a chance. If spades are 3-3, you will be fine. Play the top spades, ruff the third round and then throw a diamond on the fourth round as the opponents get their queen.

The extra chance comes if spades are 4-2. If you lay down the ♥A and find RHO with ♥Q-x-x and a doubleton spade, you can still make your contract. How?


After getting the bad news in hearts, you play the top spades ending in dummy, and then play a third spade. If RHO ruffs with his natural trump trick, you throw your losing diamond. If he declines to ruff, you ruff and go back to dummy's ♥K and play a fourth spade. Again, if East ruffs, you throw your diamond. Ifhe discards again, you ruff, ruff a club and play the fifth spade (now good) to throw your diamond loser.

Why won't this work if you start with the ♥K? Because if LHO has ♥Q-x-x, you can't benefit from 4-2 spades the wrong way. You have to ruff the third spade and LHO will overruff and cash a diamond winner.

Summary: If spades are 3-3, any play in hearts will work. But what if spades are

4-2 and the person holding two spades also holds ♥Q-x-x? You can make the contract if RHO has that holding, but not when LHO does. Accordingly, the correct play is to win the ♣J (throwing a diamond from dummy) and play the ♥A next. You make on any 2-1 heart split or if West has three hearts or if West has no hearts and spades behave.

This was the Real Deal:



Declarer played correctly, playing the ♥A first. The bad news was only temporary. Declarer turned his attention to spades and plan B came home. If you had started with the ♥K, you'd have survived on the actual layout, but not if the East-We.st hands were reversed.

Hurricane Season is upon us again and there is so much that all of us need to keep in mind to ensure the safety of our family and our property. Please take the time to prepare now. South Florida has not experienced a major hurricane since 2005 with Wilma, so residents should be vigilant and not complacent this hurricane season, taking into account all hazardous scenarios.

Even though Pembroke Pines is not in a coastal evacuation zone, some residents may still be asked to evacuate. Those living in low-lying areas may be required to evacuate due to flooding; and all residents of mobile homes must evacuate when a storm reaches hurricane status, and possibly even with tropical storm status. Early arrangements

should be made for any elderly family member or those with special needs. A two week supply of needed medications is also recommended. Broward County's Department of Elderly Services coordinates Special Needs shelters, however, preregistration is required. In Pembroke Pines, five shelters will be open for those needing to evacuate.

The City of Pembroke Pines Emergency Management Team has developed a plan of action that deals with before, during, and after a hurricane or storm. Should the City encounter a direct impact from a hurricane, the goal is to quickly stabilize the situation and provide immediate assistance to residents and businesses.

At a recent National Hurricane Conference held in Orlando, the importance of social media's role in communicating about hurricanes was discussed. The City of Pembroke Pines' Facebook page at https:// www.facebook.com/ cityofpembrokepines will play a critical role in ensuring that correct and timely information is shared with residents. The City's website at www.ppines. com also shares important information about preparation and what to do right before, during and after a storm.

I am pleased to share with

you that Pooches in Pines, a community group of dedicated volunteers in Pembroke Pines that helps unite dogs found by the Pembroke Pines Police with their owners, is now an official charity of our city. On May 16, 2016, our office released the 2016 Estimate of Taxable Values. This is the fifth consecutive year Broward property values have increased after years of declines during the historic real estate collapse. This year Broward County has experienced a total countywide taxable value increase of 162.448 billion or 8.45%, over 2015 values. The 8.45% increase represents the sum total of all taxable value in Broward County. Some areas, such as Coconut Creek, Dania Beach, Fort Lauderdale, Hallandale Beach, Hollywood, North Lauderdale and Parkland saw a taxable value increase greater than 8.45%, while Coral Springs, Lighthouse Point, Pembroke Park, Plantation, Southwest Ranches and Weston saw an increase of less than 8.45%. To see a breakdown by taxing authority (County, Municipal, School Board, etc.), go to our website, www.bcpa.net, click "SiteOndex" on the left side of the homepage, then click "2016CTaxCRollCInformation," and finally "2016CJuneC1stCTaxableCValueC Report."

The numbers released May 16th will be virtually identical to the final numbers formally confirmed by the Certification of Tax Roll on July 1, 2016. The only changes, if any, will be to correct any error or omissions discovered over the next few weeks, to update tangible personal property values based upon returns not yet received/processed, and to extend any exemptions received and approved for tax year 2016. All new 2016 exemptions and Save our Home portability applications filed to date are already reflected in these numbers.

Please keep in mind the 2016 property assessments reflect the values as of January 1, 2016. Pursuant to Florida Law property assessments are based upon qualified sales of comparable properties during the prior year. Thus, the 2016 property assessments are based upon qualified sales from January 2, 2015 thru January 1, 2016. Any sales which occur in the 2016 calendar year will be reflected in the 2017 property assessments.

BROWARD COUNTY COMMISSIONER, BEAM FURR

Greetings Hollybrook,

On the June 7th Commission Meeting, the Broward County Commission voted to set a proposed expansion of the Homestead Exemption for Seniors for a Public Hearing. This would allow our residents over the age of 65 whose household earns \$28,482 a year or less to double their Homestead Exemption from \$25,000 to \$50,000. This item will be heard on August 16th 2016 at the Broward Government Center at 2 PM. If you would like to come speak on this item, you are welcome to attend the meeting and fill out a speaker card.

I am supporting this item because I think it's important for our seniors to be able to stay in their homes here in Broward County. As we know, many of our residents who are over the age of 65, live on a fixed income. This means that every year as our economy improves, and home values rise, our residents feel the squeeze a little bit more when it's time to pay their taxes. That isn't right. Broward County has been home to so many who have worked for so many years, and came from all across the country to make this place home in their retirement.

Retired residents are often those who volunteer the most of their time to charitable and community minded causes, and though these jobs are unpaid, they generate so much value for our community. I think it is beyond unfortunate when those who have saved for retirement find themselves in desperate economic times, with fewer prospects than ever for real employment. That isn't right.

By allowing seniors to double their homestead exemption from \$25,000 to \$50,000, where those seniors earn \$28,482 a year or less in their household, we can make sure that the most vulnerable residents can choose to stay at the homes that they have owned and occupied for decades. I couldn't imagine how difficult it would be for a resident of Hollybrook to have to consider leaving their



city & county

home, their friends, and the community that sustains them because of their inability to pay property taxes. The County's office of Management and Budget estimate that 10,000 seniors across the county could directly benefit from this policy.



Finally, the massacre in Orlando this past weekend is yet another reminder that regardless of what the National Rifle Association (NRA) says, guns kill people!


The NRA continues to say guns don't kill people, people kill people. No my friends, guns kill people, and with an AR-15, they kill a lot of people very quickly.
