

We are a private **FAMILY CAMPGROUND** with strict **QUIET HOURS** from **10:30pm-8am**.

Between 10:30pm and 8:00am Keep voices low; sound carries easily in the clear mountain air.

- Music - must be turned OFF. Daytime - must be contained within your site only.
- Generators - must be turned OFF. Daytime - run sparingly.
- Alcohol - consume **ONLY on your campsite at all times**; do not carry around the campground.
- Not allowed anytime - **offensive behavior**. Report disturbances to the office first thing the next morning.

2. **NO REFUNDS/ RAINCHECKS** after 2:30pm on your check-in day / if you leave early / for no shows.
3. **FIREWOOD: collecting deadwood (scavenging) is illegal in Kananaskis Country. Fines start @ \$250.00.**
You may bring firewood or buy it at the Trading Post. And please don't pick the flowers!
4. **TENTS: place on site's gravel pad or you will be asked to move them. Picnic tables must remain on the site.**
5. **SPEED LIMIT: 15km/hr** - please watch for children playing. All terrain vehicles/dirt bikes not allowed.
6. **PETS: must be well-behaved, leashed, may not be left alone on the site. Please clean up after them.**
7. **CAMPFIRES:** permitted in designated firepits only. **Do not leave unattended.** No Fireworks/crackers.
No smoking is permitted inside the tipis or trapper's tents.
8. **VALUABLES:** keep locked in the trunk of your vehicle. **BEDS** in tents: please leave arranged as found.
9. **VISITORS:** must leave the campground **by 11 pm..** Visitors are your responsibility & stayovers must be signed in.
10. **THIS IS BEAR COUNTRY** *** All mountain campgrounds practice food & garbage control.
> Store in closed vehicle when not in use: food/ coolers/garbage/ items with strong odour (e.g. toiletries, candles).
... It is illegal not to do so. Items may be removed; fines may be levied.
> No food / coolers / garbage allowed at any time in your tent. No garbage in the firepit.
> Put all waste food, litter & garbage in sealed **GARBAGE BAGS** – these must go into the **BEAR-PROOF BINS**.

WASHING DISHES For sanitary reasons: **ONLY at your campsite/ NOT at the Water Wells or in Washroom Sinks.**

- a) wipe food scraps into garbage bags first- dishes should be as clean as possible; then wash dishes,
- b) if no food scraps/grease in dishwater (only gray water) - distribute in bushes over wide area,
- c) put down flush toilets only if unable to strain out food/grease. Do NOT put food/grease in outdoor toilets.

CHECK-OUT TIME 11 am for tipis & trappers' tents / 12 noon for campsites.

Heaters & Lanterns in Tipi / Trapper's Tent ***Follow the Heater Instructions inside each tent.

Damages resulting from not following the instructions correctly are the responsibility of the camper.

- Practice lighting your heater & lantern on arrival. Ask the office if you need help before it closes for the evening.
- Heater refueling by staff occurs once in the afternoon daily, so they will NOT return at a later time.
- Turn the heater / lantern OFF when you leave the site. Damage to the lantern **GLASS** is subject to a \$ 10.00 charge.
- Trapper's Tent Windows - always leave partially open for ventilation when the heater /lantern is on.

Tipis are an Adventure! *When it's raining, use the "drip trick" (old native trick):*

Tipis naturally shed water down the inside of their poles. If the water hits a knot in the wood, it may start to drip so there may be some drips on the beds when you go in. To **retrack the drip** over the knot & down the pole again:

- Lick your finger and rub the knot on the pole up & down several times; then drag your finger down the pole **8-10"**. This should retrack the drip over the knot (surface tension).
- If you can't reach the knot, try using a twig or....hey, just move your bed (but leave a 3' clearance for the heater).
- Do not remove the raincatcher near the top or the ozan hanging beneath it (the ozan helps to catch stray drips).

Info for All Campers

Emergency Calls (police / ambulance / fire) - dial 911

- * Failure to abide by these rules may result in eviction without refund; please inform members of your group.
- * Trails along the river are not supervised; river banks are undercut in places – extreme caution required.
- * If you do not want your name/site number given out to visitors asking for you, you must notify the office at check-in.
- * Sites unoccupied for more than 24 hours are considered vacant unless the office is notified of your absence beforehand.
- * **Trading Post Washrooms are closed for cleaning every day after lunch (outhouses are always open)** and for brief periods of maintenance. At this time, notices will be posted in the washrooms.
