

Tri-Level Program

Saint Bede offers classes in a tri-level program. The program consists of an Honors level, College Prep, and Academic level. Under our guidance, students and parents are allowed to choose the level that best fits the needs of the individual student.

- **Honors**
The most challenging of levels. Courses at this level are weighted, allowing a student to earn up to a 5.0 GPA.
- **College Preparatory**
Most St. Bede Students find themselves in the college preparatory level. This level challenges the students and prepares them for post secondary education.
- **Academic Level**
The academic level offers more supportive learning environment. These classes meet graduation requirements, along with meeting the needs of the more challenged student.

Grading System

A weighted grade system allows the student to attain a G.P.A. higher than the standard 4.0 scale. The scale is as follows: A - 4, B - 3, C - 2, D - 1, F - 0. Additional weighting is given to the Honors and Advanced Placement level courses: A - 5, B - 4, C - 3, D - 2, F - 0.

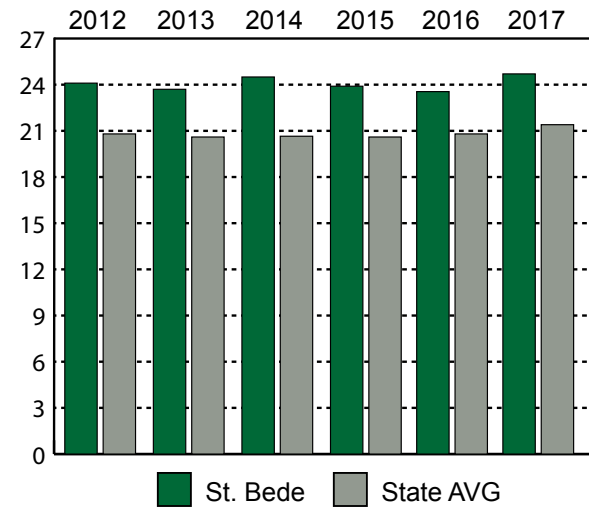
BUILDING CHARACTER...

2016-2017 Academic Highlights

- Our top three students in the Class of 2017 were members of the *News Tribune* All-Academic Team. Valedictorian, Annie Needs of Peru (Calvin College, MI), Elisha Li of Peru (University of Illinois), and Andrew Kim of LaSalle (University of Illinois). Michael Manning of Ladd (University of Illinois) received Honorable Mention recognition.
- 74 student-athletes were named to the Three Rivers Athletic Conference All-Academic team by maintaining a cumulative GPA above 3.0 for the 2016-2017 school year
- Varsity sports teams earning recognition from the IHSA with the Team Academic Achievement Award include: Girls' Volleyball (3.02); Girls' Golf (3.38); Boys' Cross Country (3.16); Girls' Tennis (3.30); Girls' Basketball (3.37); Boys' Basketball (3.02); Girls' Bowling (3.12).
- Senior Annie Needs received the Illinois High School Association's top award given to a graduating senior by being named to the 2017 Academic All-State team.

2016-2017 Athletic Highlights

- The Bruin football team returned to the state playoffs after a one year hiatus. The team defeated Westchester St. Joe before falling to Newman Central. Three players were named Class 2A Academic All-State: Brady Booker, Sean Kinsella, and Michael Manning.
- Senior Girls golfer Aiko Mendoza was named Player of the Year for both the *News Tribune* and the *Bureau County Republican*. Aiko, Peyton Pyszka, and John Potthoff all advanced to the sectional round of the IHSA Golf tournament for girls and boys.
- Bret Dannis is the Class 2A State Champion for the 110-meter hurdles defending his 1A championship from 2016. He went on to finish second in the 300-meter hurdles setting new school records in both races. Bret also competed in the U.S. Junior Olympic races and is currently ranked 4th in the nation.
- The largest class to-date was honored with the Fr. Kevin Gorman Award as 12 new members went in. Stephanie Boehm, Xavier Braboy, Julia Browning, Courtney Cook, Emily Edwall, Evan Knoblauch, Adam Lenkaitis, Michael Manning, Joe Marenda, Thea Mauck, Josh Sapp, and Braidy Shipp entered for the Class of 2017.
