The merger of FABSCRAP and Reclypt represents a significant step for the future of circular fashion. By combining our strengths to invest in the sustainable future of NYC's fashion industry, we're cultivating a collaborative, creative community committed to change. This merger is more than a strategic alliance—it's a celebration of resilience, partnership, and our shared optimism for the future.

FABSCRAP endeavors to end commercial textile "waste." To maximize the value of unused fabric, FABSCRAP is a convenient and transparent service, is an affordable and accessible materials resource, and is educating and empowering a diverse community of changemakers. Since 2016, FABSCRAP has diverted more than 1,800,000 pounds of textile waste, from over 850 brand, and engaged over 8,000 volunteers in support of their mission.

Reclypt is a hub that explores the nuances and complexities of fashion, and has become a supportive platform to navigate individual impact while starting, growing, or expanding your circular journey. Reclypt hosts events across NYC for individuals to meet like-minded people and explore circular practices. Since 2021, Reclypt has hosted over 50 workshop-type events, reaching over 700 people, and cultivated thousands of like-minded individuals in NYC's circular fashion community.

Reclypt's work and successful programming will now occur at FABSCRAP. Reclypt's founder, Rachel Ceruti, joins the FABSCRAP team as its inaugural Director of Partnerships, Outreach, and Education.

The circular fashion community can look forward to new events, increased access to material resources, expanded volunteer opportunities, and deeper contextual conversations. For the first time, a complete Community Calendar for 2025 will be available soon, full of events to bring us all together.
