



Craft Beer Menu

- 1. Delirium Tremens** Pale Ale **\$58**

Feels like the sound shot of alcohol is igniting the mouth. In reality the tongue and palate are warmed. The taste is characterized by its roundness. The aftertaste is strong, long-lasting and dry bitter.

ABV: 8.5%
- 2. Delirium Nocturnum** Strong Dark Ale **\$58**

Initially, a very good mouthfeel of alcohol and softness. This is followed by an increasing bitterness, partially from the hop, but also from the roasted malt and chocolate malt. Towards the end a nice balance between bitterness, sour and sweet.

ABV: 8.5%
- 3. Delirium Argentum** IPA **\$58**

Full-bodied, intense and a touch of caramel. Together with the spicy, citrus-like bitterness, they give this beer a complex and very pleasant fresh, full and bitter aftertaste.

ABV: 7%
- 4. Delirium Red** Fruit Beer **\$58**

Deep dark red colour, with a light pink, compact and lacing head. Aroma comes in fruity, with hints of almond and mildly sour cherries. Flavoured as sweet and fruity, with a nice balance between sweet and sour. An excellent dessert beer..

ABV: 8%

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- 5. Brouwerij Bosteels Pauwel Kwak** Strong Dark Ale **\$58**
 Kwak is recognizable by its deep bright amber color and a dense, creamy colored head. The pale wood of the glass holder makes a pleasant contrast with the beer. Smell the mellow fruity and malty aroma with a slightly spicy character (coriander, hops). Additional earthy and very subtle aromas of banana and perhaps also a whiff of pineapple or mango in the background. The bitterness always remains in the background but in the end emerges delicately.
 ABV 8.4%
- 6. Brouwerij Bosteels Tripel Karmeliet** Tripel **\$58**
 Tripel Karmeliet has soft, full, rich grain character with hints of banana, vanilla, and a slight, pleasing bubble-gum aroma. A restrained hop bitterness offers perfect balance and a gentle counterpart to its substantial maltiness
 ABV 8.4%
- 7. Schloss Eggenberg Radler Naturub** Fruit Beer **\$58**
 An excellent light beer, mixed half with pure lemon juice. Radler has a crisp, fresh, light nose and aromatic lemon flavour. The crisp fresh blend with lemon, lime and elderberry lemonade is a great thirst quencher.
 ABV 2.6%
- 8. Lost Coast Alleycat** Amber Ale **\$58**
 A full-flavored amber ale made with roasted caramel malt. Richly colored and medium-bodied, Alleycat is an assertive blend of malts with a sprightly cascade of hops.
 ABV 5.5%
 IBU: 15.4
- 9. Belgian Floris Fraise** Fruit Beer **\$58**
 Very mild, sweet fruity beer, with an excellent balance between sweet and sour (a result of the fruit used).
 ABV 3.6%

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| <p>10. <u>Belgian Floris Mango</u></p> <p>An excellent mouthfeel because of the use of 100% fresh mango juice. The aftertaste is sweet and fruity.</p> <p>ABV 3.6%</p> | <p>Fruit Beer</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>11. <u>Gulden Draak</u></p> <p>It has fruity (apple and cherry) and zesty aromas. Caramel, toffee, roast-malt and coffee flavours precede a long, bitter-sweet finish.</p> <p>ABV 10.5%</p> <p>IBU: 18</p> | <p>Dark Tripel</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>12. <u>Gulden Draak 9000 Quadruple</u></p> <p>Experienced 25-years growing process. Extremely rich and complex tastes sensation but the sweet caramel touch still reserves in Gulden draak. On basis of 3 different kinds of malt added in a 4 - times the amount of traditional Gulden Draak.</p> <p>ABV 10.5%</p> <p>IBU: 25</p> | <p>Quadrupel</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>13. <u>Bruges Zot Blond</u></p> <p>Hints of citrus aroma can be discovered, and the refermentation in the bottle creates a longer natural preservability. The sweetness are balanced by a certain bitterness and dryness.</p> <p>ABV: 6%</p> <p>IBU: 23</p> | <p>Blonde</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>14. <u>Bruges Zot Dubbel</u></p> <p>This one can discover the scent of honey, almonds, chocolate and even brown sugar. It is known to leave a warm glow in the mouth with a bitter and hoppy finish lending towards liquorice and even coffee roast.</p> <p>ABV: 7.5%</p> <p>IBU: 27</p> | <p>Dubbel</p> <p>\$58</p> |

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| <p>15. <u>Straffe Hendrik Tripel</u></p> <p>Blend of six special varieties of malt gives the beer a well-balanced and powerful taste.</p> <p>The palate initiates a hint of caramel, soon flowing into a certain bitterness. In the finish one can discover citrus fruits and even subtle flavours of banana.</p> <p>ABV: 9%</p> <p>IBU: 35</p> | <p>Tripel</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>16. <u>Straffe Hendrik Quadruple</u></p> <p>Complex character, combining a delicate dryness with hints of coriander, dark fruits, anise and roasted chestnuts. The palate finishes in a syrupy taste.</p> <p>ABV: 11%</p> <p>IBU: 35</p> | <p>Quadrupel</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>17. <u>Iron Fist Renegade Blonde</u></p> <p>The number one obstacle for blondes wishing to go rouge is figuring out which side they're currently on. I suppose our Renegade Blonde is no exception. It's an ale. Believe me I checked... But when it's young, it has a crisp, malty flavor with a refreshingly bitter finish, not unlike a lager. With age, it develops a mild, fruity character, like an ale.</p> <p>ABV: 5.2%</p> | <p>Blonde</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>18. <u>Founders All Day IPA</u></p> <p>A session IPA with tons of flavor without the high alcohol content. Naturally brewed with a complex array of malts, grains and hops. Balanced for optimal aromatics and a clean finish.</p> <p>ABV: 4.7%</p> | <p>IPA</p> <p>\$58</p> |

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| <p>19. <u>Founders Centennial IPA</u></p> <p>Get ready to bask in the glory of the frothy head's floral bouquet. Relish the citrus accents from the abundance of dry hopping. This one's sweet, yet balanced. Malty undertones shake hands with the hop character for a finish that never turns too bitter.</p> <p>ABV: 7.2%</p> | <p>IPA</p> | <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>20. <u>La Guillotine</u></p> <p>A complex smell, with a citrus aroma, followed by hop aromas such as Saaz, Brewers Gold and Amarillo. Golden blond, multigrain beer, with a very persistent, lacing head. Initially rather sweet, because of the alcohol. The intense taste and roundness mask the presence of high bitterness.</p> <p>ABV: 8.5%</p> | <p>Belgian Strong Ale</p> | <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>21. <u>Averbode Abdij Abbaye</u></p> <p>Averbode is a blonde abbey beer, dry-hopped and with a second fermentation in the bottle. The result is a refreshing, full -mouthed and rather bitter beer, offering an intense moment.</p> <p>ABV: 7.5%</p> | <p>Belgian Strong Ale</p> | <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>22. <u>Het Nest Ace of Spades</u></p> <p>An amber colored beer. The use of a Brettanomyces during the second fermentation gives the beer a unique taste and flavor. Tomahawk and Simcoe hops give the beer refreshing fruity nose of citrus and grapefruit.</p> <p>ABV: 6.5%</p> | <p>Amber Ale</p> | <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>23. <u>Het Nest Jack of Spades</u></p> <p>A "La Chouffe" inspired tripel born of the first brewing experiments. The use of coriander and Cascade hops gives the beer its fruity touch.</p> <p>ABV: 8.5%</p> | <p>Tripel</p> | <p>\$58</p> |

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| <p>24. <u>Het Nest Ten of Clubs</u></p> <p>With its coffee and chocolate taste, will definitely warm you up.
ABV: 10%</p> | <p>Stout</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>25. <u>Het Nest King of Hearts</u></p> <p>Brewed with the first European hops like Fuggles and Hallertau.
ABV: 6.5%</p> | <p>Blonde</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>26. <u>Het Nest Queen of Diamonds</u></p> <p>Inspired by traditional saison or farmhouse ale style. For the fermentation we used a French saison yeast strain. The combination of American hops and an ancient wheat type give the beer its refreshing character.

| <p>27. <u>961 Witbier</u></p> <p>Inspired by the Belgian Witbier. The added coriander and orange peel add a sweet and spicy aroma. The light acidity and low bitterness of this unfiltered beer makes it perfect for those who prefer a light and sweet beer. This beer is bottle conditioned and has natural yeast sediment in the bottle.</p> | <p>Witbier</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>28. <u>961 Lebanese Imperial Stout</u></p> <p>This beer is based on Sweet Stout with 7.5% ABV. The result of using cold water espresso coffee beans is a discreet and delicate coffee aroma blended in with the roasted aromas from dark malts and other spicy aromas traditionally associated with Stouts. The taste is slightly sweet, medium bodied with a well balanced bitterness and after palate.</p> | <p>Imperial Stout</p> <p>\$58</p> |
| <p>29. <u>961 Lebanese Pale Ale</u></p> <p>Based on an English IPA, used Lebanese herbs, such as Za'atar, sumac, chamomile, sage, anise, and mint in the brewing process. Distinctive Lebanese aroma and flavors with 6.3% ABV.</p> | <p>Pale Ale</p> <p>\$58</p> |
