Ethiopia is next!

Africa Missions plans to be in Ethiopia this month! The tickets have been purchased. Clinics on Evangelism that will empower pastors to grow their local churches are arranged in three strategic regions. **Herman Hinsbeek** and **Gossah Hamda**, who is from Ethiopia, are eager to get there to spearhead this new initiative.

This development to launch into Ethiopia came much sooner than originally planned. Initially we thought of launching into Ethiopia in 2017. However, the opportunity came and the Lord directed us to seize the moment!

The church in Ethiopia is as old as Christianity itself. It started at the cross and took fire when an Ethiopian Eunuch became a believer and was baptized by Philip in the Gaza desert. (Acts 8:26-40)

Jobe Koosimile Honored

Botswana—During the Easter Conference of the AFM in Botswana, where Dr. Frank Chikane and Ron were the speakers, Africa Missions honoured Pastor Jobe Koosimile for his involvement in missions.

He served in Ireland for a season and has also supported projects in Uganda and other African countries.

What made Jobe very special to Ron is that Jobe was in his final year of study and graduated from the Central Bible College where Ron was the principal. That same year, Ron bid the CBC farewell to launch Africa Missions. Since then and without Ron's knowledge, Jobe closely monitored the activities of Africa Missions. He participated in several outreaches and happened to be present when history was made. He was, for instance, the graduation speaker at the Njoro Bible College in Kenya that Ron founded 12 years earlier. What made this occasion special is the

fact that it was also the last graduation before Africa Missions officially handed over the Bible College to the national leadership in Kenya. He was also present when Ron and an Africa Missions team crossed the border into Rwanda, which was a historical moment for the church and Bible College training in that country.

During that crossing into Rwanda, the team conducted an open air crusade. Several people responded and accepted the Lord as their personal Saviour. This was a high moment for Ron as he felt like he finally gave birth that day to the vision the Lord gave him three years earlier when the first hand was raised to accept Jesus as Lord. What Ron did not know was that any outdoor activity of any church had to be authorized by the Government. Ron was approached by a gentleman who questioned whether permission had been obtained. Ron admitted that ignorance of the law was no excuse and that he had to accept that he was wrong and that the open air service was illegal.

The same man approached Jobe who did the preaching and helped to lead souls to the Lord. He pointed out that any outdoor activity of any




church was illegal if permission was not obtained. Jobe also admitted that we were at fault. The man continued to probe until he found out that Jobe came from Botswana and knew his best friend, who also happened to be from Botswana. He was also impressed that we brought a message focused on reconciliation and peace. He became very co-operative and said in a stern voice, "If you do what you did today anywhere in Rwanda and

you are confronted by anyone, refer that person to my office as I am the Commissioner of Police!" The door into Rwanda swung wide open and the rest is history!

Jobe is still pursuing his passion for missions in his new role as the leader of the church in Botswana. The theme of the conference was "Our Missional

Mandate". He addressed the conference in the closing session on Easter Sunday and delivered an inspired message that moved many to tears.

We honour Pastor Jobe Koosimile for his influence as leader and for his passion for missions. Yesterday led to the erection of several monuments and no doubt he will respond to new challenges tomorrow!

Something else very interesting is that the Coptic church claims to be in possession of the **ARK OF THE COVENANT!**

Egypt, Sudan, and Ethiopian were all very strong Christian countries. A relentless war was waged by those of a different faith and virtually overnight Egypt fell to them. Sudan resisted the onslaught in many places and the war is still going on today largely in the Nuba mountains and in the South. A large part of Ethiopia resisted hence there is a strong presence of Coptic churches in certain parts of the country. These churches are largely traditionally Coptic (orthodox).

We understand that the church at large is very open to having the Gospel spread in their areas and further afield. There are many different groups who seem to be “open” to working together to establish the Kingdom of God in that country. We will empower those churches who want to participate to grow themselves which will invariably lead to the planting of new churches.
