The Department of Human Resources' Family & Children Service Unit investigates reports of child abuse/neglect.3. Law Enforcement	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Churches2. Radio & PSA's by the District Attorney3. Flyers/literature about the age of consent in Alabama4. Newspaper articles about child abuse/neglect reporting5. Presentations concerning the age of consent in Alabama

Action steps that will result in progress toward meeting the identified need:

1. The Department of Human Resources will continue to make presentations to educational personnel concerning child abuse/neglect to support its child abuse prevention program.
2. Local law enforcement and the Department of Human Resources will continue to support each other in investigating reports of child abuse/neglect. DHR and local law enforcement have an established protocol that outlines how the agencies will assist in the completion of reports of child abuse/neglect.
3. All community partners will continue to raise awareness about child abuse and neglect.
4. The Department of Human Resources will provide to the local high school information pertaining to the age of consent in Alabama.

Perry County Extension Office - Reality Check (financial literacy education)	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. A satellite office of Career Link needs to be established in Perry County which would provide services to Perry County at least one time per month.2. Transportation

Action steps that will result in progress toward meeting the identified need:

1. The County Extension Office will be supported in educating the public about financial literacy.
2. A partnership will be established with Dallas County Career Center to help meet the needs of people in Perry County to increase their job readiness skills.
3. The Perry County Department of Human Resources will continue to provide job training to clients receiving public assistance.
4. The efforts to teach parents and students how to apply for jobs will continue to be supported.
