Alexander is a practicing lawyer. He was previously an infantry officer with the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry (PPCLI) for 13 years, where he achieved the rank of Major. He served as platoon commander in Bosnia in 2000, a civil-military co-operation officer in Afghanistan in 2002, and a liaison and staff officer in Afghanistan in 2006/2007. In 2009/2010, he commanded B Company (Parachute), 3rd PPCLI, and mentored an Afghan battalion in combat in Zari District, Kandahar, and in the Battle for Marjeh Helmand Province. He was awarded the Chief of Defence Staff Commendation for his work liaising with warlords and supervising civil aid projects in Kandahar in 2002.

He received the Chief of Land Staff commendation in 2008 for his work as 3 PPCLI adjutant in 2008, specifically for his efforts working with the families of dead and wounded soldiers. He also worked as an instructor, Brigade and unit training officer, and as a general's executive assistant.

He is a graduate of the US Army Ranger School. Alexander lives in Edmonton with his spouse Tatum, who is also a lawyer, and their son Ronan.
