NO STONE LEFT ALONE
RAKOWICKI CEMETERY
SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

Note: This document is meant to outline the sequence of events that will take place on 01 September 2017 for the 'No Stone Left Alone' event and all its participants.

0830 hrs: Military and civilians arrive at Rakowicki Cemetery; members are broken down into their working groups and positioned for tasks.

0900 hrs: Student school buses arrive, park as per plan.

0900 hrs to 930 hrs: Student groups are confirmed, and placed in locations.

945 hrs: Groups move to their areas. Soldiers will be with the students at this time.

0945 hrs to 0955 hrs: Final confirmation that all groups are in place and ready for event.

0950 hrs to 0955 hrs: Participants arrive and move to the Cenotaph location.

1000 hrs: Official welcoming of the guests by the Emcee - Principal of the Elementary School 58 in Kraków, Mr. Jerzy Zychal.

1006 hrs: Canadian anthem, "O Canada" (in English a capella and, or with military orchestra) performed by the choir of the ES 58 in Kraków. Polish anthem "Mazurek Dabowskiego", (a capella and, or with military orchestra) performed by the choir of ES 58 in Kraków.

(5 speeches, 4 minutes each)

1012 hrs: Mr. Zychal introduces first speaker, Jeremy Wallace, Chargé d'Affaires

1016 hrs: Mr. Zychal introduces the second speaker, Deputy Speaker Jacek Krupa.

1020 hrs: Mr. Zychal introduces the third speaker, No Stone Left Alone Organization, President, Maureen Bianchini-Purvis.

1024 hrs: Mr. Zychal introduces the fourth speaker, City of Kraków representative, P. Król.

1028 hrs: Mr. Zychal introduces the fifth speaker, Gen. Grzegorz Halupka.

To honour all soldiers' headstones with the symbol of remembrance, **the poppy.**



1032 hrs: John McCrea poem “In Flanders Fields” read by a student of the ES 58 in Kraków.

1036 hrs: “Commitment to Remember” read by a student of the ES 58 in Kraków.

1040 hrs: “Act of Remembrance” read by a soldier

1057 hrs to 1058 hrs: Bugler / recorded music plays Last Post, upon completion the flag is lowered to half-mast by members of the Rakowicki Cemetery staff.

1058 hrs to 1059 hrs: One minute of silence will be observed by all.

1059 hrs to 1100 hrs: “Rouse” by a trumpeter or recording.

1100 hrs to 1102 hrs: Laying down of wreaths

UPON COMPLETION THE STUDENTS COMMENCE THE LAYING OF POPPIES AND THE VIGIL IS DISMISSED.

We will have announced to the audience that they are welcome to go and pay their respects on the cemetery grounds while the students are laying poppies. When the students complete their row, they are to hold in location at the end of the row until the last poppy is laid. Once done, the word will be given to move to their respective buses or the administration building. Military members will go to the administration building and wait for the buses to arrive for departure.

The entire celebration will be translated by the City of Kraków. (Polish and the Canadian flags will be lowered.) 100 children will take part in the celebration.

By the Cenotaph, there will be an ES 58 Banner, Scouts and the armed Polish Military Guard, armed.
