In the Civil Rights Division, he fought to protect the rights of those being discriminated against in housing, employment, retail, and education, and was an unwavering advocate for disability rights.

Prior to joining the Attorney General's Office, Dylan worked as political director for Healey's campaign managing her statewide field organization and digital media. As an organizer for **Senator Elizabeth Warren's** campaign in 2012, he managed Warren's field organization on the South Coast. Dylan is the only candidate in the race with **experience** fighting for working families on the state level.
