



The processional music being ended, the Bishop Presiding says

Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

People And blessed be his kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.

The Bishop Presiding says

ALMIGHTY God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

THE PRESENTATION

The Bishops and People sit. Representatives of the diocese, both Priests and Lay Persons, standing before the Bishop-elect saying

Dede, Bishop in the Church of God, the clergy and people of the Diocese of Albany, trusting in the guidance of the Holy Spirit, have chosen Jeremiah David Williamson to be a bishop and chief pastor. We therefore ask you to lay your hands upon him and in the power of the Holy Spirit to consecrate him a bishop in the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

The Bishop Presiding then directs that testimonials of the election be read

When the reading of the testimonials is ended, the Bishop Presiding requires the following promise from the Bishop-elect

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, I, JEREMIAH DAVID WILLIAMSON, chosen Bishop of the Church in Albany, solemnly declare that I do believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of The Episcopal Church.

The Bishop-elect then signs the above Declaration in the sight of all present.

The witnesses add their signatures.

All stand. The Bishop Presiding then says the following and asks the response of the People.

Brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, you have heard testimony given that Jeremiah David Williamson has been duly and lawfully elected to be a Bishop in the Church of God to serve in the Diocese of Albany. You have been assured of his suitability and that the Church has approved him for this sacred responsibility. Nevertheless, if any of you know any reason why we should not proceed, let it now be known.

If no objection is made, the Bishop Presiding continues

Is it your will that we ordain Jeremiah a Bishop?

People That is our will.

Bishop Presiding Will you uphold Jeremiah as Bishop?


People We will.

The Bishop Presiding then says

The Scriptures tell us that our Savior Christ spent the whole night in prayer before he chose and sent forth his twelve apostles. Likewise, the apostles prayed before they appointed Matthias to be one of their number. Let us, therefore, follow their examples, and offer our prayers to Almighty God before we ordain Jeremiah for the work to which we trust the Holy Spirit has called him.

For the mission of the Church, that in faithful witness it may preach the Gospel to the ends of the earth, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For those who do not yet believe, and for those who have lost their faith, that they may receive the light of the Gospel, we pray to you, O Lord. Lord, hear our prayer.

For the peace of the world, that a spirit of respect and forbearance may grow among nations and peoples, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For those in positions of public trust, especially Joseph, our President, Kathleen, our Governor, and Katherine, our Mayor, that they may serve justice and promote the dignity and freedom of every person, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For a blessing upon all human labor, and for the right use of the riches of creation, that the world may be freed from poverty, famine, and disaster, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For the poor, the persecuted, the sick, and all who suffer; for refugees, prisoners, and all who are in danger; that they may be relieved and protected, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer*.

For ourselves; for the forgiveness of our sins, and for the grace of the Holy Spirit to amend our lives, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For all who have died in the communion of your Church, and those whose faith is known to you alone, that, with all the saints, they may have rest in that place where there is no pain or grief, but life eternal, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Rejoicing in the fellowship of the ever-blessed Virgin Mary, blessed Matthias, and all the saints, let us commend ourselves, and one another, . . .

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

All sit as isaiah williamson reads

THE FIRST READING: ACTS 1.15-26

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus— for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.' (Now this man acquired a field with the reward of his wickedness; and falling headlong, he burst open in the middle and all his bowels gushed out. This became known to all the residents of Jerusalem, so that the field was called in their language Hakeldama, that is, Field of Blood.) 'For it is written in the book of Psalms, "Let his homestead become desolate, and let there be no one to live in it"; and "Let another take his position of overseer." So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

THE EPISTLE: PHILIPPIANS 3.13b-21



If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. 

The Bishop Presiding addresses the Bishop-elect

THE EXAMINATION

My brother, the people have chosen you and have affirmed their trust in you by acclaiming your election. A bishop in God's holy Church is called to be one with the apostles in proclaiming Christ's resurrection and interpreting the Gospel, and to testify to Christ's sovereignty as Lord of lords and King of kings.

You are called to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the church; to celebrate and to provide for the administration of the sacraments of the New Covenant; to ordain priests and deacons and to join in ordaining bishops; and to be in all things a faithful pastor and wholesome example for the entire flock of Christ.

With your fellow bishops you will share in the leadership of the Church throughout the world. Your heritage is the faith of patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and those of every generation who have looked to God in hope. Your joy will be to follow him who came, not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.

Bishop Presiding Are you persuaded that God has called you to the office of bishop?

Answer I am so persuaded.

The following questions are then addressed to the Bishop-elect by one or more of the other bishops.

Bishop Will you accept this call and fulfill this trust in obedience to Christ?

Answer I will obey Christ, and will serve in his name.

Bishop Will you be faithful in prayer, and in the study of Holy Scripture, that you may have the

mind of Christ?

Answer I will, for he is my help.

Bishop Will you boldly proclaim and interpret the Gospel of Christ, enlightening the minds and

stirring up the conscience of your people?

Answer I will, in the power of the Spirit.

Bishop As a chief priest and pastor, will you encourage and support all baptized people in their

gifts and ministries, nourish them from the riches of God's grace, pray for them without

ceasing, and celebrate with them the sacraments of our redemption?

Answer I will, in the name of Christ, the Shepherd and Bishop of our souls.

Bishop Will you guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church?

Answer I will, for the love of God.

Bishop Will you share with your fellow bishops in the government of the whole Church; will you

sustain your fellow presbyters and take counsel with them; will you guide and strengthen

the deacons and all others who minister in the Church?

Answer I will, by the grace given me.

Bishop Will you be merciful to all, show compassion to the poor and strangers, and defend those

who have no helper?

Answer I will, for the sake of Christ Jesus.

All stand. The Bishop Presiding then says

JEREMIAH, through these promises you have committed yourself to God, to serve his Church in the office of bishop. We therefore call upon you, chosen to be a guardian of the Church's faith, to lead us in confessing that faith.

Bishop-elect We believe in one God.

Then all say together

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.




All remain standing, except the Bishop-elect, who kneels before the Bishop Presiding.

A period of silent prayer follows, the people still standing. The Bishop Presiding then begins

THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

OD and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Father of mercies and God of all comfort, dwelling on high but having regard for the lowly, knowing all things before they come to pass: We give you thanks that from the beginning you have gathered and prepared a people to be heirs of the covenant of Abraham, and have raised up prophets, kings, and priests, never leaving your temple untended. We praise you also that from the creation you have graciously accepted the ministry of those whom you have chosen.

The Bishop Presiding and other bishops now lay their hands upon the head of the Bishop-elect, and say together

Therefore, Father, make Jeremiah a bishop in your Church. Pour out upon him the power of your princely Spirit, whom you bestowed upon your beloved Son Jesus Christ, with whom he endowed the apostles, and by whom your Church is built up in every place, to the glory and unceasing praise of your Name.

The Bishop Presiding continues

To you, O Father, all hearts are open; fill, we pray, the heart of this your servant whom you have chosen to be a bishop in your Church, with such love of you and of all the people, that he may feed and tend the flock of Christ, and exercise without reproach the high priesthood to which you have called him, serving before you day and night in the ministry of reconciliation, declaring pardon in your Name, offering the holy gifts, and wisely overseeing the life and work of the Church. In all things may he present before you the acceptable offering of a pure, and gentle, and holy life; through Jesus Christ your Son, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be honor and power and glory in the Church, now and for ever.

The People in a loud voice respond

A Bible is then presented with these words

RECEIVE the Holy Scriptures. Feed the flock of Christ committed to your charge, guard and defend them in his truth, and be a faithful steward of his holy Word and Sacraments.

The Bishop Presiding presents to the people their new bishop. The Clergy and People offer their acclamation and applause.

THE PEACE

The New Bishop The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

The Bishop Presiding and other bishops greet the new bishop.

The People are asked to remain in their places as they greet one another.

The new bishop may also greet other members of the clergy, family members, and the congregation.

INSTALLATION OF THE TENTH BISHOP OF ALBANY

The Bishop Presiding and the Co-consecrators are conducted to seats at the High Altar. The Dean of the Cathedral conducts the new bishop to the Sanctuary who stands before the President of the Standing Committee.

The President addresses him, saying:

RIGHT Reverend Father in God, it has pleased Almighty God to call you to be the Chief Shepherd and Servant of the servants of God in this Diocese, and we have witnessed this day your Ordination and Consecration as a Bishop in the Church of God. In the Name of Christ we acknowledge and welcome you as the duly elected Tenth Bishop of Albany. All things are now ready that you may be installed in the Chair designated by custom and tradition as the Seat of the Bishop of Albany. It remains only for you to take the Oath pertaining to this Office and Ministry.

The Bishop takes the Oath upon the Book of the Gospels, open to the place where it is written, "Among you, whoever wants to be great must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be the willing slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give up his life as a ransom for many."

I JEREMIAH DAVID WILLIAMSON, Bishop in the Church of God, duly elected, acknowledged by you, and now to be installed as Bishop of Albany, do solemnly promise to be a faithful Shepherd to you, and that I will observe and to the utmost of my power fulfill the responsibilities and obligations of this Office. So help me God and the contents of this Book.

The President of the Standing Committee presents the Pastoral Staff of the Bishops of Albany with these words,

Right Reverend Father in God, we deliver into your hands the Pastoral Staff of the Bishops of Albany and we entrust you with a goodly heritage. Keep faith with those who have labored before you, gently tend the flock committed to your charge, and put your trust in the Good Shepherd who laid down his life for his friends. *Amen*.

A fanfare is played as the Dean of the Cathedral conducts the Bishop to the Cathedra.

Seating him in his place, the Dean says,

In the name of the Chapter of this Cathedral Church, and on behalf of the Clergy and People of this Diocese, I install you, Jeremiah, Bishop of Albany, in the Chair assigned to your dignity, with all and singular its rights and privileges, and I do give into your use for occasions incident to the exercise of your Office this Cathedral of All Saints in the City and Diocese of Albany. May the Lord preserve your going out and your coming in from this time forth for evermore. *Amen*.

The People remain standing as the Bishop kneels down in his place and offers this prayer for the Diocese

God, by your grace you have called us in this Diocese to a goodly fellowship of faith. Bless all our people, our clergy, and me, your humble servant. Grant that your Word may be truly preached and truly heard, your Sacraments faithfully administered and faithfully received. 





Facing the People, the Bishop offers the following Invitation

The gifts of God for the People of God.

The ministers receive the Sacrament in both kinds, and then immediately deliver the same to the People.

The Bread and the Cup are given to the communicants with these or similar words

The Body (Blood) of our Lord Jesus Christ keep you in everlasting life. Amen.

The People are asked to follow the directions of the ushers to the Communion stations which are situated around the Cathedral. All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood in the Episcopal Church. Communion is offered in both kinds. At this service those who wish to receive the consecrated Wine may do so in one of two ways. You may receive directly from the Chalice or you may receive by intinction. If you wish to receive by intinction, the minister will take the Host (Bread) from your hand and dip it into the Wine and then put it on your tongue. If you do not wish to receive Communion, you may receive a blessing by crossing your arms on your chest. All are welcome at the Altar.



THE GIFTS

Various vestments & insignia distinguish the office and ministry of a bishop. Friends and family of the Bishop, people and clergy of the Diocese of Albany, and parishes Bishop Williamson has served as a priest have contributed to the provision of these symbols for the Tenth Bishop of Albany.

The Bishop's personal pastoral staff was crafted by his father, David Williamson, and is the gift of his family. The wood for the staff is from his grandparents' farm. The staff signifies the office of the bishop as a pastor, *i.e.* shepherd, of the people. The pastoral staff is also regarded as a symbol of jurisdiction. Thus, it is only carried within a bishop's own diocese.

The pectoral cross is a silver Canterbury cross, set with an amethyst. It has been given by the people of Christ Church, Gilbertsville. "Amethyst" derives from the Greek word which means "not drunk." This stone is traditional for bishops who are the successors to the apostles who, St. Peter assured the crowd, were not drunk on the Day of Pentecost.

The Bishop's ring is sterling silver, set with a Herkimer diamond engraved with the diocesan seal. Herkimer diamonds are a type of quartz crystal mined only in the Mohawk Valley, in our diocese.

The Hood of the Bishop's Cope is adorned with the seal of the Diocese of Albany. A matching stole is the gift of the people of St. Paul's Church, Greenwich.

A set of Eucharistic vestments is given by the clergy of the Diocese of Albany. The vestments have been designed and fabricated by Martha Munafo, vestment maker to The Cathedral of All Saints.

The mitre is the traditional headdress of a bishop. Bishops wear different mitres on different occasions. A gold mitre is for festive occasions and St. Andrew's Church, Toledo, Ohio, has given a mitre of cloth of gold. A simpler white mitre with red fringe is the gift of Grace and St. Stephen's Church, Colorado Springs, Colorado. St. George's Church, Clifton Park, has given a plain mitre, the everyday mitre of a bishop.

The Bishop's choir habit is the gift of Deacons Allen Carpenter, and Sandra & William Tatem.

The Pastoral Staff of the Bishops of Albany was given to the first Bishop of Albany, The Right Reverend William Croswell Doane, for his use and the use of his successors. The formal presentation of this Staff is part of the traditional installation of the Bishops of Albany. The Staff is the product of four years of work by thirty-nine craftsmen in London. Its pole is made of aluminium, a metal that was relatively rare at the time. It was given by Anna Parker Pruyn in 1897. Needed repair and conservation of the staff has been funded by St. George's Church, Schenectady.

THE CATHEDRAL OF ALL SAINTS +

Known as "the Pioneer Cathedral," The Cathedral of All Saints in the City and Diocese of Albany is the first cathedral in the Episcopal Church to be built on the scale of the cathedrals of Europe and to have a constitution which vested its governance in a chapter of clergy and laity chaired by the Bishop. As the Seat of the Bishop, it is the spiritual and missionary center of the diocese which spans nineteen counties of New York State. Its grand gothic interior was designed to accommodate the great congregations attending events of diocesan, ecumenical, and civic significance. It has been the venue of many episcopal consecrations and enthronements, and six Albany bishops repose within its walls, including the founder, The Right Reverend William Croswell Doane.
