How to vote in the City of Toronto mayoral by-election if you don't have housing!

## What is my voting address if I don't have housing?

Wherever you have sleep or eat the most is your voting address. This could be a shelter, drop-in, food bank, or the closest intersection to where you sleep or are encamped. You can vote at a designated voting location in the ward in which you sleep or eat the most.

## How do I get on the voter's list?

If you aren't on the voters' list or have a voting card, no problem! When you go to a voting location to vote, just tell the staff, and they will help you to fill out a quick form called a *Voters' List Amendment Application*.

## Do I need identification?

Nope. If you tell the staff that you don't have housing (you have "no fixed address"), you will not be required to provide any identification. Just filling out and signing the Voters' List Amendment Application is enough!

## Are you sure I don't need ID?

Very sure! But, if you feel uncomfortable about going to vote without identification or a home address, you can request a letter from a shelter, if you are staying in one. Ask the shelter staff to give you a letter on their official letterhead saying that you are currently staying there. You don't have to do this, but it can make the process a little faster if you're a shelter resident.
